What is Alf-verifier?

Alf-verifier is an Eclipse plugin that implements a lightweight method for verifying if the operations attached to the classes of a UML class diagram are Strongly Executable.

An operation is Strongly Executable (SE) if it is always successfully executed, i.e. if every time we execute the operation, the effect of the actions included in the operation evolves the initial state of the system to a new system state that satisfies all integrity constraints of the structural model.

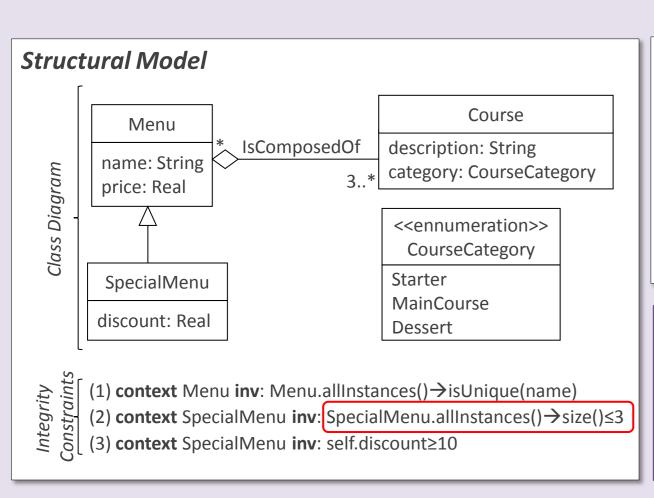
INPUT

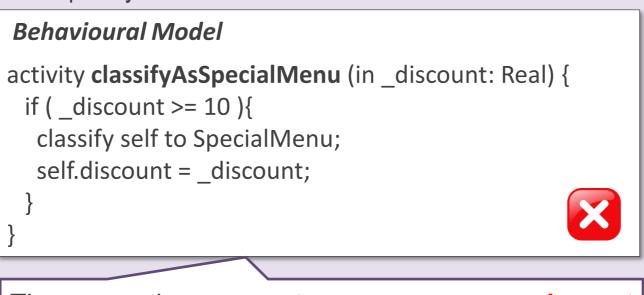
1 Specify the UML executable model to be verified.

Alf-verifier takes as input an executable model composed by:

(1) A UML class diagram and a set of OCL integrity constraints.

(2) A set of operations specified by means of Alf —an OMG-standard action language to specifiy detailed behavioural models.





The operation *classifyAsSpecialMenu* is not strongly executable since after its execution the integrity constraint maximum SpecialMenu may be violated

Select the operation to be verified and invoke the verifier.

Aff-Verifier



OUTPUT

- 3 Alf-verifier returns either:
 - ✓ A positive answer, if the input operation is Strongly Executable
 - A negative answer + a corrective FEEDBACK, if the input operation is **NOT SE**

The feedback consists in a set of actions and preconditions that should be added to the operation in order to make it strongly executable.

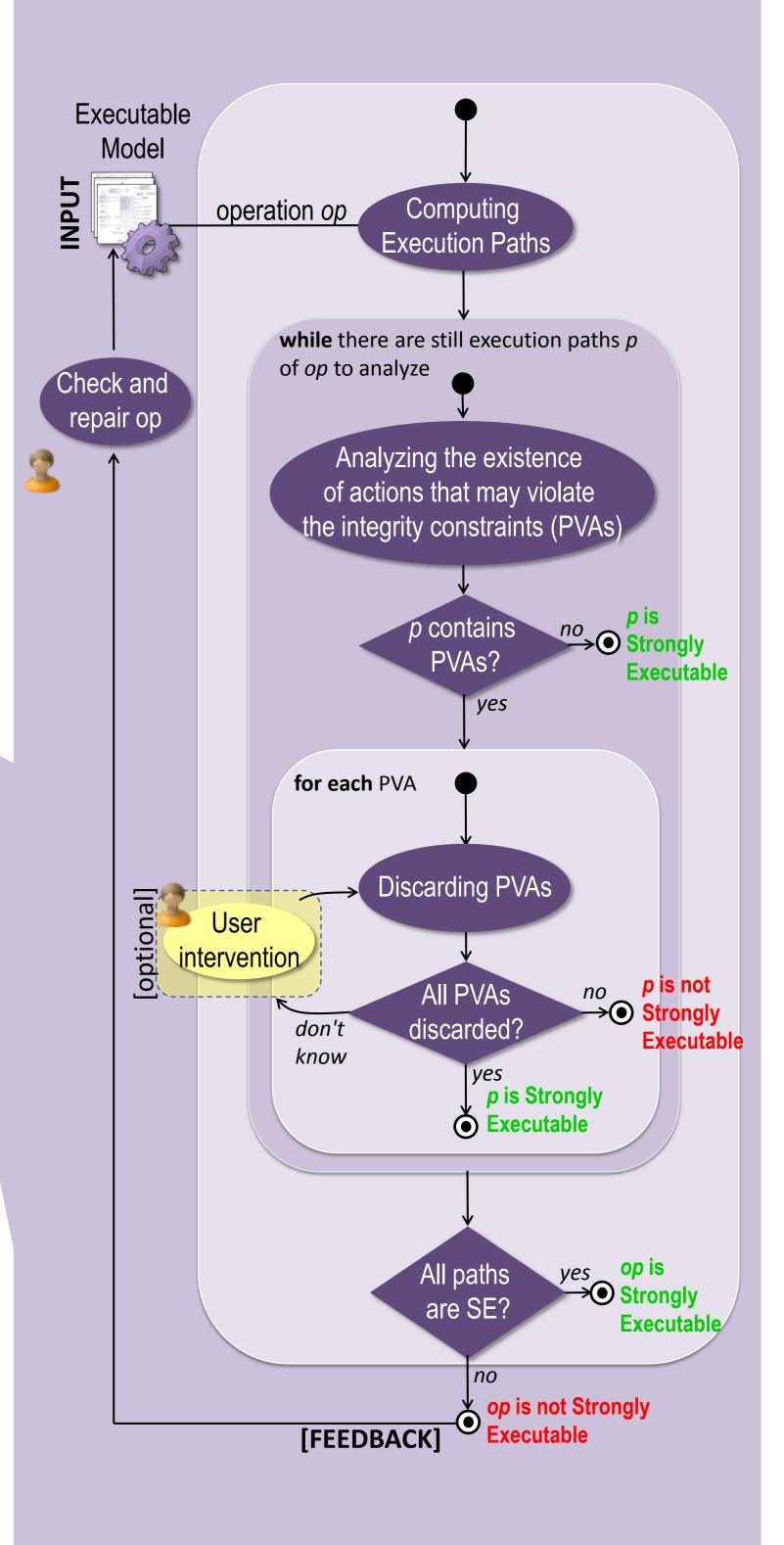
In order to avoid the violation of the constraint context SpecialMenu inv: SpecialMenu.allInstances() \rightarrow size() \leq 3, a precondition ensuring there are less than three special menu should be added.

Now, the operation *classifyAsSpecialMenu* is strongly executable

How it internally works?

It performs an static analysis (i.e. without executing the operation) of each execution path of the operation.
