  - Elasto-Acoustic Coupling : to reproduce earthquakes
  - Modeling the effects of the ocean on seismic waves



• The medium : a Land Area surrounded by a thin Fluid zone

# **Motivations**

#### **Configuration, Difficulty and Method**



#### Difficulty

Apply a FEM on a mesh with thin cells in the Fluid and much larger in the solid

#### Method

Replace the Fluid layer by an Equivalent boundary condition

Approach : an asymptotic method

- Ouple this condition with the elastic wave equation
- Use a FEM

### An Elasto-Acoustic Problem with a Thin Layer

Framework and Issue

The Problem  $(\mathbf{P}_{\varepsilon})$  set in a smooth bounded domain  $\Omega^{\varepsilon} = \Omega_{s} \cup \Gamma \cup \Omega_{f}^{\varepsilon}$ :



#### Assumption

(i)  $\underline{C}(x) = (C_{ijkl}(x))$  is symmetric :  $C_{ijkl} = C_{jikl} = C_{klij}$ . (ii)  $C_{ijkl}(x)$  are real valued smooth functions, up to  $\Gamma$ . (iii)  $\exists \alpha > 0$ ,  $\forall \xi = (\xi_{ij})$  sym. tensor,  $\sum_{i,j,k,l} C_{ijkl} \xi_{ij} \overline{\xi_{kl}} \ge \alpha \sum_{i,j} |\xi_{ij}|^2$ .

### **Weak Solutions**

Variational Problem  $(VP)_{\varepsilon}$ 

- $V_{\varepsilon} = \{(\mathbf{u}, \mathbf{p}) \in \mathrm{H}^{1}(\Omega_{\mathrm{s}}) \times \mathrm{H}^{1}(\Omega_{\mathrm{f}}^{\varepsilon}) \,|\, \gamma_{0}\mathbf{p} = 0 \text{ on } \Gamma^{\varepsilon} \}$
- For all  $\varepsilon > 0$ ,  $(VP)_{\varepsilon}$  writes : Find  $(u_{\varepsilon}, p_{\varepsilon}) \in V_{\varepsilon}$  such that

$$\forall (\mathbf{v},q) \in V_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} \;, \qquad a_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} \left( (\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}},p_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}), (\mathbf{v},q) \right) = \left\langle F, (\mathbf{v},q) \right\rangle_{V_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}',V_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}}$$

$$\begin{split} \mathbf{a}_{\varepsilon} \left( (\mathbf{u}, \mathbf{p}), (\mathbf{v}, \mathbf{q}) \right) &\coloneqq \int_{\Omega_{\mathsf{f}}^{\varepsilon}} \left( \nabla \mathbf{p} \cdot \nabla \bar{\mathbf{q}} - \kappa^2 \mathbf{p} \bar{\mathbf{q}} \right) \, \mathrm{d} \mathbf{x} \\ &+ \int_{\Omega_{\mathsf{s}}} \left( \underline{C}(\mathbf{x}) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u} : \underline{\nabla} \bar{\mathbf{v}} - \omega^2 \rho \mathbf{u} \bar{\mathbf{v}} \right) \, \mathrm{d} \mathbf{x} + \int_{\Gamma} \left( \omega^2 \rho_f \mathbf{u} \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \bar{\mathbf{q}} + \mathbf{p} \bar{\mathbf{v}} \cdot \mathbf{n} \right) \, \mathrm{d} s \end{split}$$

### **Uniform Estimates**

Some resonant frequencies may appear in the solid

#### **Assumption (SA)**

The angular frequency  $\omega$  is not an eigenfrequency of the problem

$$\begin{array}{ll} \nabla \cdot \underline{c}(x) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u} + \omega^2 \rho \mathbf{u} = 0 & \text{ in } \Omega_{\rm s} \\ \underline{c}(x) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u} \, \mathbf{n} = 0 & \text{ on } \Gamma \, . \end{array}$$

#### Theorem

Under Assumption (SA),  $\exists \varepsilon_0 > 0$ ,  $\forall \varepsilon \in (0, \varepsilon_0)$ , the problem  $(VP)_{\varepsilon}$  with data  $F \in V'_{\varepsilon}$  has a unique solution  $(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}, \mathbf{p}_{\varepsilon}) \in V_{\varepsilon}$  and

$$\|\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}\|_{1,\Omega_{\mathrm{s}}} + \|\mathbf{p}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}\|_{1,\Omega_{\mathrm{f}}^{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}} \leqslant C \|F\|_{V_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}} .$$

**Application** : Convergence of an asymptotic expansion as arepsilon o 0.

Key for the proof: introduce a "Scaled Problem"

# Scaled Problem $(\mathfrak{P})_{\varepsilon}$

Formulation in a fixed domain

• For any function p defined in  $\Omega_{f}^{\varepsilon}$ , define p in  $\Omega_{f} := \Gamma \times (0, 1)$ :

$$p(\mathbf{x}) = \mathfrak{p}(\Psi(y_{lpha}), S) \,, \ \ S = rac{s}{arepsilon} \in (0, 1) \,.$$

- $V = \{(\mathbf{u}, \mathbf{p}) \in \mathrm{H}^1(\Omega_s) \times \mathrm{H}^1(\Omega_f) \,|\, \mathbf{p}(., 1) = 0 \text{ on } \Gamma \}$
- $(\mathfrak{P})_{arepsilon}$  writes : Find  $(\mathbf{u},\mathfrak{p})\in \mathit{V}$  such that  $orall (\mathbf{v},\mathfrak{q})\in \mathit{V}$

# Scaled Problem $(\mathfrak{P})_{\varepsilon}$

**Uniform estimates** 

#### Lemma

Under Assumption (SA),  $\exists \varepsilon_0 > 0$ ,  $\forall \varepsilon \in (0, \varepsilon_0)$ , any solution  $(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}, \mathfrak{p}_{\varepsilon}) \in V$  of problem  $(\mathfrak{P})_{\varepsilon}$  with a data  $\mathfrak{F}_{\varepsilon} \in V'$  satisfies

$$\|(\mathsf{u}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}},\mathfrak{p}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}})\|_{0,\Omega_{ ext{s}} imes\Omega_{ ext{f}}}+\|\mathsf{u}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}}\cdot\mathsf{n}\|_{0,\Gamma}+\|\mathfrak{p}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}}\|_{0,\Gamma}\leqslant C\|\mathfrak{F}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}}\|_{V'}\;.$$

### Sketch of the proof of the Lemma

Proof by contradiction.

Assume :  $\exists (\mathbf{u}_m, \mathbf{p}_m) \in V, m \in \mathbb{N}$ , satisfying  $(\mathfrak{P})_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}_m}$  associated with  $\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}_m \to 0$ and  $\mathfrak{F}_m \in V'$  such that

 $\|(\boldsymbol{u}_m,\boldsymbol{\mathfrak{p}}_m)\|_{\boldsymbol{0},\boldsymbol{\Omega}_S\times\boldsymbol{\Omega}_{f}}+\|\boldsymbol{u}_m\cdot\boldsymbol{n}\|_{\boldsymbol{0},\boldsymbol{\Gamma}}+\|\boldsymbol{\mathfrak{p}}_m\|_{\boldsymbol{0},\boldsymbol{\Gamma}}=1 \quad \text{and} \quad \|\mathfrak{F}_m\|_{\boldsymbol{V}'}\to \boldsymbol{0}$ 

- Prove that  $\|(\mathbf{u}_m, \mathfrak{p}_m)\|_W \leq C$ with  $W = \{(\mathbf{u}, \mathfrak{p}) \in V | \mathfrak{p} \in \mathrm{H}^1(0, 1; \mathrm{L}^2(\Gamma)), \mathfrak{p}(., 1) = 0 \text{ on } \Gamma \}$
- $\label{eq:compactness argument:} {\bf u}_m \to {\bf u} \quad \text{in} \quad {\bf L}^2(\Omega_s) \text{ and } {\mathfrak p}_m \to {\mathfrak p} = {\mathfrak 0} \quad \text{in} \quad {\bf L}^2(\Omega_{\mathfrak f}).$
- 3 Prove that  $\|\mathbf{u}\|_{0,\Omega_s} + \|\mathbf{u}\cdot\mathbf{n}\|_{0,\Gamma} = 1$
- Using (SA), we prove u = 0 : contradiction

### Methodology

**Framework** :  $\Gamma$ ,  $\Gamma^{\varepsilon}$  smooth surfaces in  $\mathbb{R}^3$ . Smooth data

• Step 1 : Derive an Asymptotic Expansion for  $({f u}_{m arepsilon},{f p}_{m arepsilon})$  when m arepsilon o 0

$$\begin{aligned} \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}(x) &= \mathbf{u}_{0}(x) + \varepsilon \mathbf{u}_{1}(x) + \varepsilon^{2} \mathbf{u}_{2}(x) + \cdots, \\ \mathbf{p}_{\varepsilon}(x) &= \mathbf{p}_{0}(x;\varepsilon) + \varepsilon \mathbf{p}_{1}(x;\varepsilon) + \varepsilon^{2} \mathbf{p}_{2}(x;\varepsilon) + \cdots, \quad \mathbf{p}_{j}(x;\varepsilon) = \mathbf{p}_{j}(y_{\alpha},\frac{S}{\varepsilon}). \end{aligned}$$

 Step 2 : Derive Equivalent Conditions of order k ∈ N : Identify a simpler problem satisfied by

$$\mathbf{u}_{k,\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} := \mathbf{u}_0 + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon} \mathbf{u}_1 + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^2 \mathbf{u}_2 + \cdots + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^k \mathbf{u}_k$$
 up to  $\mathcal{O}(\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^{k+1})$ 

• Step 3 : Prove the Stability of Equivalent models  $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}$  and

$$\|\mathbf{u}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}}-\mathbf{u}_{oldsymbol{arepsilon}}^k\|_{1,\Omega_{ ext{s}}}\leqslant Coldsymbol{arepsilon}^{k+1}$$

### Step 1 : Multiscale Expansion

**First terms** 

• At step n = 0, we obtain

$$\mathfrak{p}_0=0\;,$$

and then  $\mathbf{u}_0$  solves the problem

$$\left\{ \begin{array}{ll} \nabla \cdot \underline{\mathcal{C}}(x) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u}_0 + \omega^2 \rho \mathbf{u}_0 = 0 & \text{ in } \Omega_s \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_0) = -\mathbf{p}_i \mathbf{n} & \text{ on } \Gamma \,. \end{array} \right.$$

• At step n = 1, we find successively

$$\mathfrak{p}_1(.,S) = (S-1) \left( \rho_f \omega^2 \mathbf{u}_0 \cdot \mathbf{n} - \partial_{\mathbf{n}} \mathbf{p}_i \right) , \quad S \in (0,1)$$

and that **u**<sub>1</sub> solves

$$\begin{cases} \nabla \cdot \underline{C}(x) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u}_1 + \omega^2 \rho \mathbf{u}_1 = 0 & \text{in } \Omega_{s} \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_1) = \rho_f \omega^2 \mathbf{u}_0 \cdot \mathbf{n} \mathbf{n} - \partial_{\mathbf{n}} p_i \mathbf{n} & \text{on } \Gamma . \end{cases}$$

# Step 1 : Multiscale Expansion

**First terms** 

$$\mathfrak{p}_{2}(.,Y_{3}) = (S^{2}-1)\mathcal{H}[\rho_{f}\omega^{2}u_{0}\cdot n - \partial_{n}p_{i}] + (S-1)\rho_{f}\omega^{2}u_{1}\cdot n$$

and then,  $\mathbf{u}_2$  solves

$$\begin{cases} \nabla \cdot \underline{c}(\mathbf{x}) \underline{\nabla} \mathbf{u}_2 + \omega^2 \rho \mathbf{u}_2 = 0 & \text{in } \Omega_{\mathrm{s}} \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_2) = \rho_{\mathrm{f}} \omega^2 \mathbf{u}_1 \cdot \mathbf{n} \mathbf{n} + \mathcal{H}[\rho_{\mathrm{f}} \omega^2 \mathbf{u}_0 \cdot \mathbf{n} - \partial_{\mathbf{n}} \mathbf{p}_i] \mathbf{n} & \text{on } \Gamma \end{cases}$$

$$\int \mathsf{T}(\mathsf{u}_2) = 
ho_{\mathsf{f}} \omega^2 \mathsf{u}_1 \cdot \mathsf{n} \, \mathsf{n} + \mathcal{H}[
ho_{\mathsf{f}} \omega^2 \mathsf{u}_0 \cdot \mathsf{n} - \partial_{\mathsf{n}} \mathsf{p}_i]\mathsf{n} \quad \text{ on } \Gamma.$$

### Step 1 : Validation of the Asymptotic Expansion

Aim : proving Estimates for Remainders

$$\mathbf{r}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{N+1} := \mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} - \sum_{n=0}^{N} \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^{n} \mathbf{u}_{n} \quad \text{in} \quad \Omega_{\mathrm{s}} \ , \quad \text{and} \quad r_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{N+1} := \mathbf{p}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} - \sum_{n=0}^{N} \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^{n} \mathbf{p}_{n} \quad \text{in} \quad \Omega_{\mathrm{f}}^{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}$$

Evaluation of the right hand sides in

$$\begin{cases} \kappa^{2} r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} + \Delta r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} &= f_{\varepsilon} & \text{ in } \Omega_{f}^{\varepsilon} \\ \omega^{2} \rho r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} + \nabla \cdot \underline{C}(x) \underline{\nabla} r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} &= 0 & \text{ in } \Omega_{s} \\ \partial_{\mathbf{n}} r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} - \rho_{f} \omega^{2} \mathbf{r}_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} \cdot \mathbf{n} &= g_{\varepsilon} & \text{ on } \Gamma \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{r}_{\varepsilon}^{N+1}) + r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} \mathbf{n} &= 0 & \text{ on } \Gamma \\ r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1} &= 0 & \text{ on } \Gamma^{\varepsilon} . \end{cases}$$

The RHS are explicit:  $f_{\varepsilon} = \mathcal{O}(\varepsilon^{N-\frac{1}{2}})$  in  $\Omega_{f}^{\varepsilon}$ ;  $g_{\varepsilon} = \mathcal{O}(\varepsilon^{N})$  on  $\Gamma$ 

Optimal Estimates :  $\|\mathbf{r}_{\varepsilon}^{N+1}\|_{1,\Omega_{s}} + \sqrt{\varepsilon} \|r_{\varepsilon}^{N+1}\|_{1,\Omega_{t}^{\varepsilon}} \leq C_{N} \varepsilon^{N+1}$ 

## Step 2 : Equivalent Conditions on Γ

Identify a simpler problem

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\varepsilon}^{k}) \quad \left\{ \begin{array}{ll} \omega^{2}\rho\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}+\nabla\cdot\underline{C}(x)\underline{\nabla}\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}=0 & \text{ in } \Omega_{\mathrm{s}} \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k})+\mathbf{B}_{k,\varepsilon}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k})=\mathbf{h}_{k,\varepsilon} & \text{ on } \Gamma \end{array} \right.$$

with  $\mathbf{B}_{k,\varepsilon}$  a surfacic differential operator.

- $k \in \{0, 1, 2\}$  for a Dirichlet b.c. on  $\Gamma^{\varepsilon}$
- $k \in \{0, 1\}$  for a Fourier-Robin b.c. on  $\Gamma^{\epsilon}$

# **Step 2 : Equivalent Conditions**

Dirichlet b.c.

• 
$$k = 0$$
:  
 $\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_0) = -\mathbf{p}_i \mathbf{n} \text{ on } \Gamma$ .  
•  $k = 1$ :  
 $\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^1) - \varepsilon \omega^2 \rho_f \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^1 \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \mathbf{n} = \mathbf{h}_{1,\varepsilon} \text{ on } \Gamma$ .  
•  $k = 2$ :  
 $\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^2) - \varepsilon \omega^2 \rho_f (1 + \varepsilon \mathcal{H}) \, \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^2 \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \mathbf{n} = \mathbf{h}_{2,\varepsilon} \text{ on } \Gamma$ 

.

### **Step 2 : Equivalent Conditions**

Example : Order 1

 $\mathbf{u}_{1, \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} = \mathbf{u}_0 + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon} \mathbf{u}_1$  satisfies the elastic equation in  $\Omega_s$  and

$$\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{1,\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}) - \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}\omega^{2}\rho_{f}\mathbf{u}_{1,\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}\cdot\mathbf{n}\,\mathbf{n} = -\mathbf{p}_{i}\mathbf{n} - \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}\partial_{\mathbf{n}}\mathbf{p}_{i}\mathbf{n} - \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^{2}\rho_{f}\omega^{2}\mathbf{u}_{1}\cdot\mathbf{n}\,\mathbf{n} \quad \text{on} \quad \boldsymbol{\Gamma}$$

We infer a simpler problem

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\varepsilon}^{1}) \quad \begin{cases} \omega^{2}\rho\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1} + \nabla \cdot \underline{C}(x)\underline{\nabla}\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1} = 0 & \text{in } \Omega_{s} \\ \mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1}) - \varepsilon\omega^{2}\rho_{f}\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1} \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \mathbf{n} = \mathbf{h}_{1,\varepsilon} & \text{on } \Gamma, \end{cases}$$

 $\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{0}) - i\omega c \rho_{f} \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{0} \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \mathbf{n} = \mathbf{g}_{0,\varepsilon}$  on  $\Gamma$ 

$$\mathbf{T}(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1}) - i\omega c\rho_{f}\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1} \cdot \mathbf{n} \, \mathbf{n} + \varepsilon c^{2}\rho_{f}(\Delta_{\Gamma} + \kappa^{2}\mathbb{I} - 2i\kappa\mathcal{H}\mathbb{I})(\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{1} \cdot \mathbf{n}) \, \mathbf{n} = \mathbf{g}_{1,\varepsilon} \quad \text{on} \quad \Gamma$$

### Step 3 : Stability and Convergence of Equivalent Conditions Step 3.1 : Stability

# **Step 3.1** : Prove that problems $(\mathbf{P}_{\varepsilon}^{k})$ are well-posed

#### Proposition

Under Assumption (SA),  $\exists \varepsilon_0 > 0$  s.t.  $\forall \varepsilon \in (0, \varepsilon_0), \forall k \in \{0, 1, 2\}$ , the problem  $(\mathbf{P}_{\varepsilon}^k)$  with data  $h_k \in L^2(\Gamma)$  has a unique solution  $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^k \in H^1(\Omega_s)$ 

 $\|\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{k}\|_{1,\Omega_{s}} \leqslant C \|\mathbf{h}_{k}\|_{0,\Gamma}$ 

**Application** : Convergence of an asymptotic expansion of  $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}$  as  $\varepsilon \to 0$ .

### Step 3.2 : Convergence of Equivalent Conditions

**Step 3.2** : Prove that the solution  $\mathbf{u}_{\epsilon}^{k}$  satisfies an error estimate

$$\|\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{arepsilon}}-\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{arepsilon}}^k\|_{1,\Omega_{\mathrm{s}}}\leqslant C \boldsymbol{arepsilon}^{k+1}$$

#### Proof :

(i) Derive an expansion of  $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}$  and show that :

$$\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k} = \mathbf{u}_{0} + \varepsilon \mathbf{u}_{1} + \varepsilon^{2} \mathbf{u}_{2} + \cdots + \varepsilon^{k} \mathbf{u}_{k} + \tilde{\mathbf{r}}_{\varepsilon}^{k+1}$$

Recall :

$$\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} = \mathbf{u}_0 + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}\mathbf{u}_1 + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^2\mathbf{u}_2 + \cdots + \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}^k\mathbf{u}_k + \mathbf{r}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{k+1}$$

hence,

$$\|\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon} - \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}\|_{1,\Omega_{s}} = \|\mathbf{r}_{\varepsilon}^{k+1} - \widetilde{\mathbf{r}}_{\varepsilon}^{k+1}\|_{1,\Omega_{s}}$$
.

(ii) There holds

$$\mathbf{T}(\tilde{\mathbf{r}}_{\varepsilon}^{k+1}) + \mathbf{B}_{k,\varepsilon}(\tilde{\mathbf{r}}_{\varepsilon}^{k+1}) = \mathcal{O}(\varepsilon^{k+1}) \quad \text{on} \quad \Gamma \; .$$

According to the step 3.1, we infer the uniform error estimates:

$$\| ilde{\mathbf{r}}_{arepsilon}^{k+1}\|_{1,\Omega_{ ext{s}}}\leqslant Carepsilon^{k+1}$$

## **Finite Element Method**

#### Joint work with : J. Diaz (INRIA).

We use a Discontinuous Galerkin Method (IPDGM).

- 2D Computational domain :  $\Omega_{\text{s}}$  is a disk of radius 0.01
- $\omega = 1.5 \times 10^6$
- Source :  $p_i(\mathbf{x}) = \exp(i\omega\mathbf{x}\cdot\mathbf{d})$  with  $\mathbf{d} = (1, 0)$
- $\bullet \ \mathbb{P}_3\text{-finite elements}$  (Lagrange) available in the Library Hou10ni
- Navier equation :

$$\mu\Delta \mathbf{u} + (\lambda + \mu)
abla \operatorname{div} \mathbf{u} + \omega^2 
ho \mathbf{u} = \mathbf{0}$$
 in  $\Omega_{\mathrm{s}}$ 

with Lamé coefficients :  $\mu = 26.32 \times 10^9$  and  $\lambda = 51.08 \times 10^9$  .

•  $c = 1500 \text{ m.s}^{-1}$ ,  $\rho_f = 1000 \text{ kg.m}^{-3}$ ,  $\rho = 2700 \text{ kg.m}^{-3}$ .

# **Numerical Simulations**

- *ɛ* = 0.0001;
- $\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}$ : analytical solution;
- $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^2$ : FE solution (equivalent model of order 2).



### **Convergence of the models**

Dirichlet b.c.

For 
$$k \in \{0, 1, 2\}$$
, we plot the L<sup>2</sup>-errors  $\|\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon} - \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}\|_{0,\Omega_{s}}$  w.r.t.  $\varepsilon$ :  
 $\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}$ : analytical solution

 $\mathbf{u}_{\epsilon}^{k}$ : analytical solution / FE solutions with Curved elements



The convergence rate coincide with the theory  $\|\mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon} - \mathbf{u}_{\varepsilon}^{k}\|_{0,\Omega_{s}} = \mathcal{O}(\varepsilon^{k+1})$ 

# **Convergence of the models**

Fourier-Robin b.c.

$$\text{ For } k \in \{0,1\} \text{, we plot the } L^2 \text{-errors } \| \mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}} - \mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^k \|_{0,\Omega_s} \text{ w.r.t. } \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}, \\$$

 $\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}$ : analytical solution

 $\mathbf{u}_{\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}}^{k}$ : analytical solution / FE solutions
