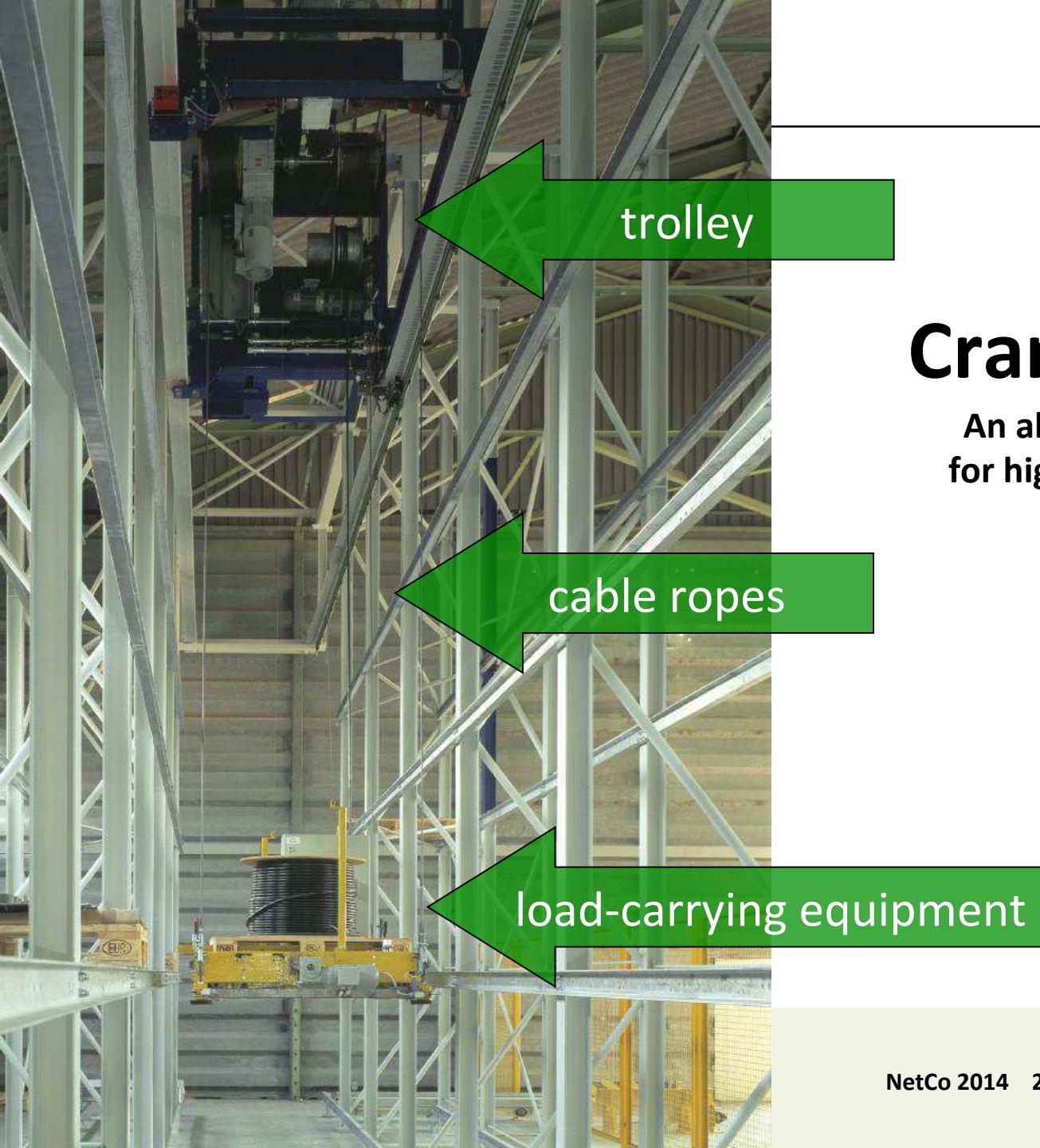

# Mathematical Task

General problem formulation of optimal control

How do I have to control the motors, so that

$$\min_{\underline{u}, \underline{x}, \underline{t}_f} \int_{\underline{t}_f}^{t_f} g(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t) dt$$

a system is brought from an initial position

$$\text{s.t. } \dot{\underline{x}}(t) = f(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t), \quad t \in [0; \underline{t}_f]$$

to a final position as good as possible

$$C(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t) \leq 0, \quad t \in [0; \underline{t}_f]$$

without overstressing?

# Optimal Control Problem

Standard formulation and methods

$$\begin{aligned} \min_{\underline{u}, \underline{x}, \underline{t}_f} \quad & \int_0^{\underline{t}_f} g(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t) dt \\ \text{s.t.} \quad & \dot{\underline{x}}(t) = f(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t), \quad t \in [0; \underline{t}_f] \\ & \omega(\underline{x}(0), \underline{x}(\underline{t}_f)) = 0 \\ & C(\underline{x}(t), \underline{u}(t), t) \leq 0, \quad t \in [0; \underline{t}_f] \end{aligned}$$

## Indirect Methods

(First optimize, then discretize)

- Reformulation to a boundary value problem using necessary conditions

## Direct Methods

(First discretize, then optimize)

- Reformulation to a nonlinear optimization problem by discretization



# Direct Methods

Numerical solution by discretization of time variable

$$t \in [0, t_f] \rightarrow t \in \{0 = t_1 \leq t_2 \leq \dots t_N = t_f\}$$

$$h_i = t_{i+1} - t_i, \quad i = 1, \dots, N-1$$

## Single Shooting/Multiple Shooting

Free Variables

$$\underline{u}^i \approx u(t_i) \quad \underline{x}^0 \approx x(0)$$

Recursive integration

$$x^i = x^i(\underline{u}^1, \dots, \underline{u}^{i-1})$$

Small + dense

## Full Discretization

Free Variables

$$\underline{u}^i \approx u(t_i) \quad \underline{x}^i \approx x(t_i)$$

Integration scheme as constraints

$$0 = x^{i+1} - x^i - h_i \cdot f(\underline{x}^i, \underline{u}^i, t_i)$$

Large + sparse

# Direct Methods

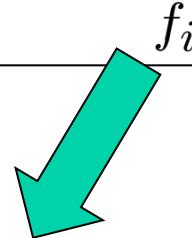
Numerical Solution by discretization of time variable and Euler's method, e.g.

$$t \in [0, t_f] \rightarrow t \in \{0 = t_1 \leq t_2 \leq \dots t_N = t_f\}$$

$$h_i = t_{i+1} - t_i, \quad i = 1, \dots, N-1$$

$$\underline{u^i} \approx \underline{u}(t_i) \quad \underline{x^i} \approx \underline{x}(t_i)$$

$$\begin{aligned} \min_{\underline{u}, \underline{x}} \quad & \sum_{i=1}^{N-1} h_i \cdot g(\underline{x^i}, \underline{u^i}, t_i) \\ \text{s.t.} \quad & \underline{x^{i+1}} = \underline{x^i} + h_i \cdot f(\underline{x^i}, \underline{u^i}, t_i), \quad i = 1, \dots, N-1 \\ & \omega(\underline{x^1}, \underline{x^N}) = 0 \\ & C(\underline{x^i}, \underline{u^i}, t_i) \leq 0, \quad i = 1, \dots, N \end{aligned}$$



High dimensional NLP problem



# Methods of Higher Order

Implicit methods for **free**

## Euler's Method

$$0 = x^{i+1} - x^i - h_i f_i$$

## Trapezoidal rule

$$0 = x^{i+1} - x^i - \frac{h_i}{2} (f_{i+1} + f_i)$$

**Hermite-Simpson:** additional point  $t_{i+\frac{1}{2}} = \frac{1}{2}(t_{i+1} + t_i)$

$$0 = x^{i+\frac{1}{2}} - \frac{1}{2}(x^{i+1} + x^i) - \frac{h_i}{8} (f_i - f_{i+1})$$

$$0 = x^{i+1} - x^i - \frac{h_i}{6} (f_{i+1} - 4f_{i+\frac{1}{2}} + f_i)$$

Precision  
of solution

- ODE holds first in later iterations
- Less variables for higher order
- Stiff ODEs, DAEs => PDEs

$\mathcal{O}(n^3)$

$\mathcal{O}(h^4)$



# Nonlinear Optimization

## Problem formulation

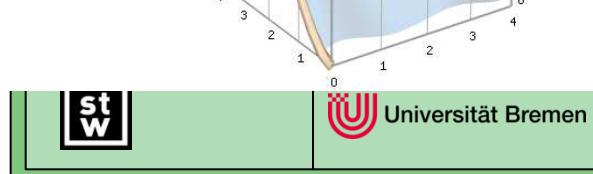
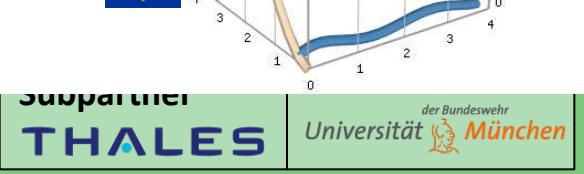
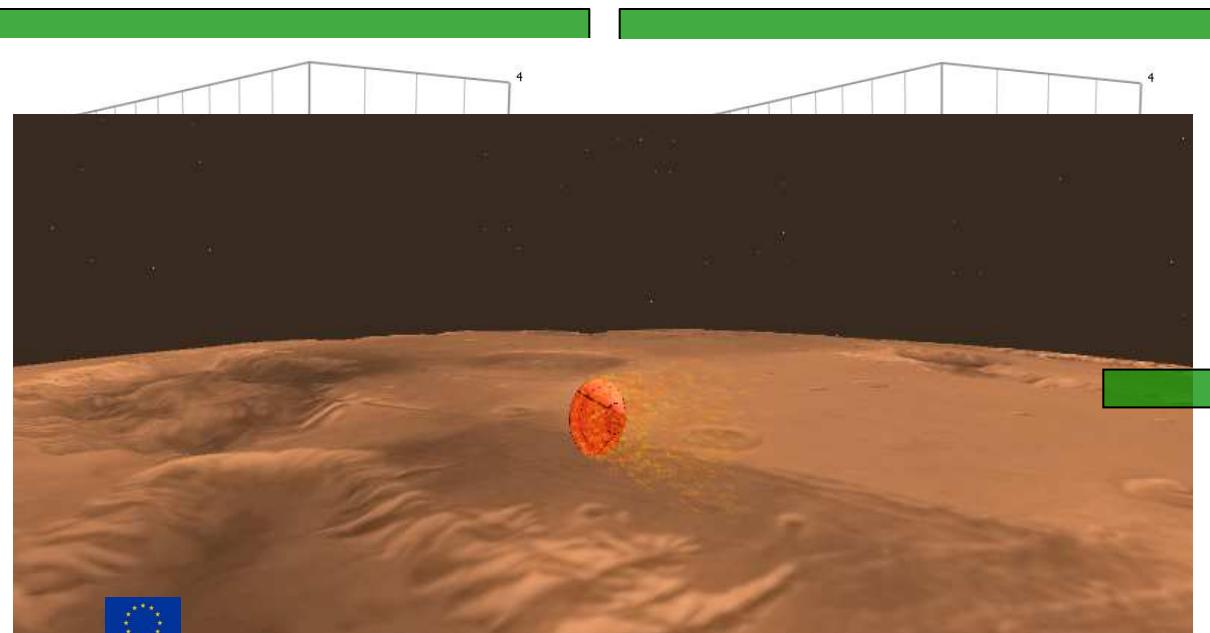
$$\begin{aligned} \min_{\mathbf{z} \in \mathbb{R}^n} \quad & F(\mathbf{z}) \\ \text{s.t.} \quad & G(\mathbf{z}) \leq 0 \end{aligned}$$

$$\mathbf{z} = (\mathbf{u}^1, \dots, \mathbf{u}^N, \mathbf{x}^1, \dots, \mathbf{x}^N)$$

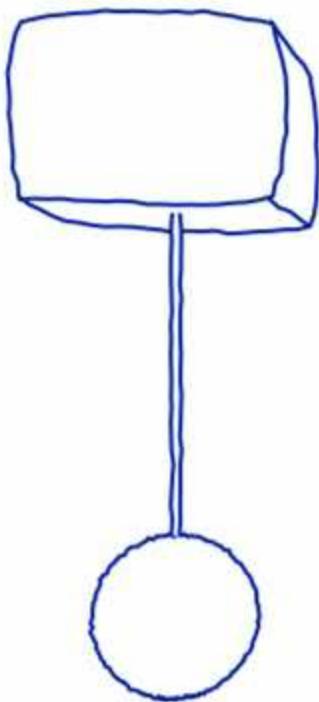

# Path Planning with TransWORHP

Move crane system from  $(S_0, L_0)$  to  $(S_f, L_f)$ .

$$\min_{u(t), x(t), t_f} t_f + \int_0^{t_f} u_1^2(t) + u_2^2(t) dt$$

s.t.

$$\dot{x}(t) = \begin{pmatrix} x_2 \\ x_5 \\ x_4 \\ x_5 - (g - x_8)\frac{x_3}{x_6} \\ u_1 \\ x_7 \\ x_8 \\ u_2 \end{pmatrix}$$

position trolley  
 velocity trolley  
 rel. displacement payload  
 rel. velocity payload  
 acceleration trolley  
 length of rope  
 velocity rope  
 acceleration rope

$$x(0) = (S_0 \ 0 \ 0 \ 0 \ 0 \ L_0 \ 0 \ 0)^T$$

$$x(t_f) = (S_f \ 0 \ 0 \ 0 \ 0 \ L_f \ 0 \ 0)^T$$

$$u_i(t) \in [u_{i,\min}; u_{i,\max}], \quad i = 1, 2$$

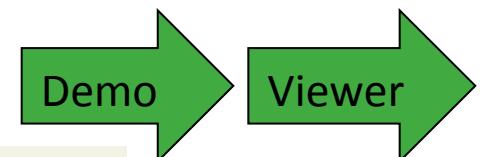

# MPC with WORHP

Nonlinear Model Predictive Control

- Hexapod-Robot with control=acceleration
  - 15 state functions
  - 7 control functions
- Predicted Pseudo-Tracking
- Optimization cycle <200 ms for each MPC step





# WORHP Zen

## Impact of small perturbations on optimal solution

- Parametric Nonlinear Programming  $(p_0, r_0, q_0) = (p_0, 0, 0)$

$$\begin{aligned} \min_{z \in \mathbb{R}^n} \quad & F(z, p) + r^T z \\ \text{s.t.} \quad & G(z, p) + q \leq 0 \end{aligned}$$

- Sensitivity derivatives of solution  $\frac{dz}{dp}(p_0)$
- Extension of sensitivity theorem of Fiacco, Robinson
  - Eliminating NLP fractals (relaxation, regularisation)
  - Without measurable computational cost
  - For free: Additional sensitivity derivatives  $\frac{dz}{dq}(0)$  and  $\frac{dz}{dr}(0)$

$$\begin{pmatrix} \nabla_z^2 L & \nabla_z G^T \\ \Delta \nabla_z G & \Gamma \end{pmatrix} \cdot \begin{pmatrix} \frac{dz}{dp}(p_0) \\ \frac{dz}{d\lambda}(p_0) \end{pmatrix} = - \begin{pmatrix} \nabla_{zp} L \\ \Delta \nabla_p G \end{pmatrix}$$



# Real-Time Optimal Control

Using sensitivity differentials of initial and final point

1. Update control for  $i = 1$

$$u^{[1]}(p) = u(p_0) + \frac{du}{dp}(p_0) \cdot (p - p_0)$$

2. Measure final state deviation  $\Delta q^i := x(t_f; u^{[i]}) - x_f$

3. While  $\Delta q^i > \varepsilon$

- a. Update control

$$u^{[i+1]}(p) = u^{[i]}(p) + \frac{du}{dq}(0) \cdot \Delta q^i$$

- b. Update deviation,  $i = i + 1$

# Convergence

**Theorem: Convergence of repeated correction method [B.]**

Assumptions:

- KKT and SSC hold
- $F, G \in C^3$

Then there exists

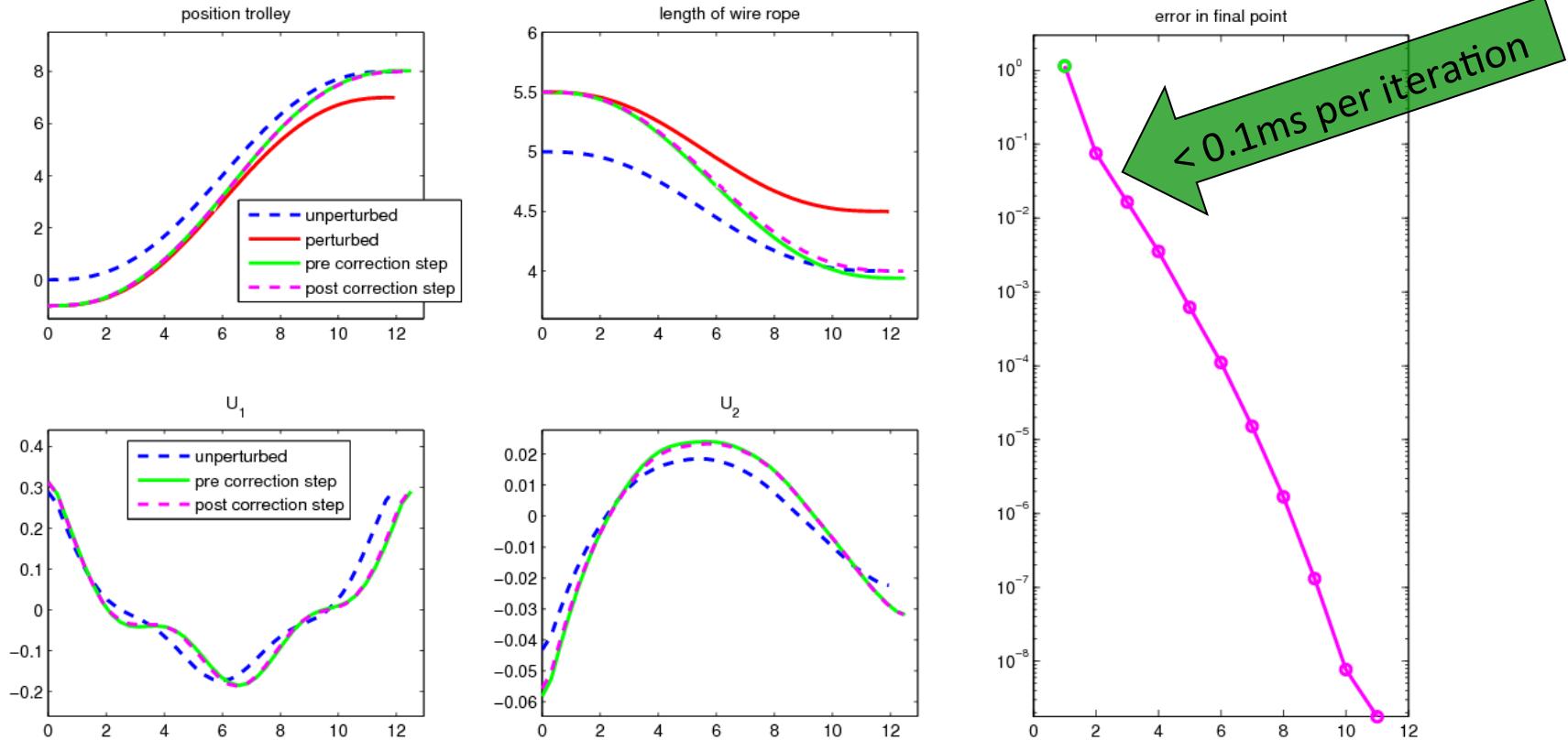
- $U(\textcolor{red}{p}_0)$
- $v \in \text{Ker}(\nabla_{\textcolor{blue}{z}} G^a(\textcolor{blue}{z}(\textcolor{red}{p}_0), \textcolor{red}{p}_0))$ ,  $\|v\| = \mathcal{O}(\|\Delta p\|^2)$

Such that for all  $p \in U(\textcolor{red}{p}_0)$ ,  $i=2,3,4,\dots$

$$\begin{aligned}\|z(p) - z^{[i]}(p)\| &= \|v\| + \mathcal{O}(\|\Delta p\|^3) \\ \|F(z(p), p) - F(z^{[i]}(p), p)\| &= \mathcal{O}(\|\Delta p\|^3) \\ \|G^a(z^{[i]}(p), p)\| &= \mathcal{O}(\|\Delta p\|^{i+1})\end{aligned}$$

Convergence to a feasible point

# Real-Time Optimal Control

Using sensitivity differentials of ode

1. Update control and state for  $i = 1$

$$u^{[1]}(p) = u(p_0) + \frac{du}{dp}(p_0) \cdot (p - p_0) \quad x^{[1]}(p) = x(p_0) + \frac{dx}{dp}(p_0) \cdot (p - p_0)$$

2. Measure deviations  $\Delta q^i := (x^{[i],j+1} - x^{[i],j} - h_j \cdot f(x^{[i],j}, u^{[i],j}, t_j))_{j=1,\dots,N-1}$

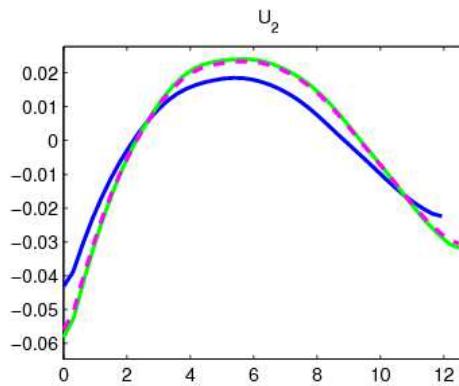
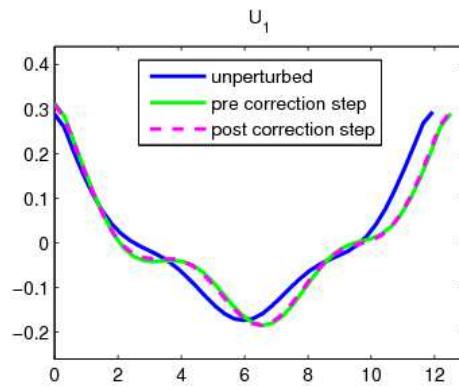
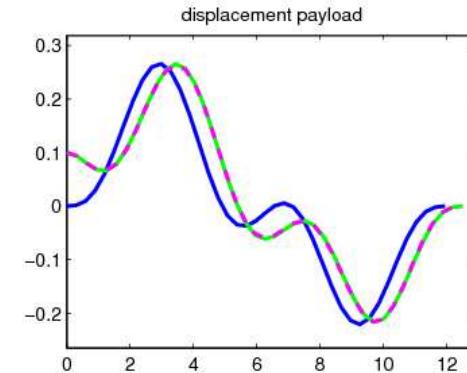
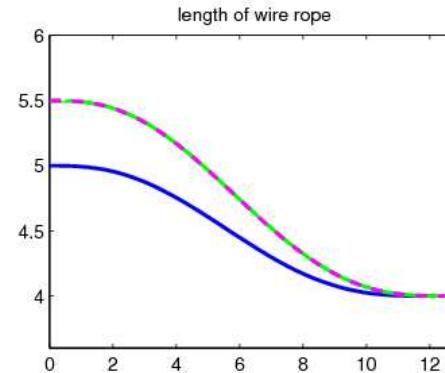
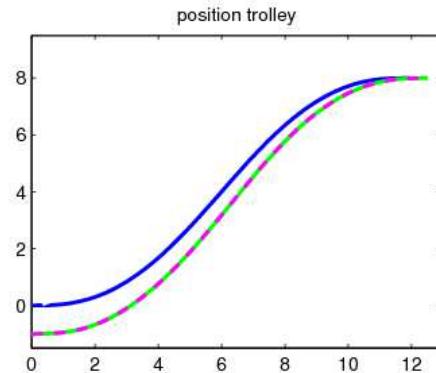
3. While  $\Delta q^i > \varepsilon$

- a. Update control and state

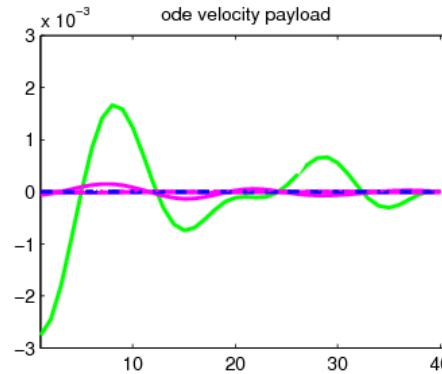
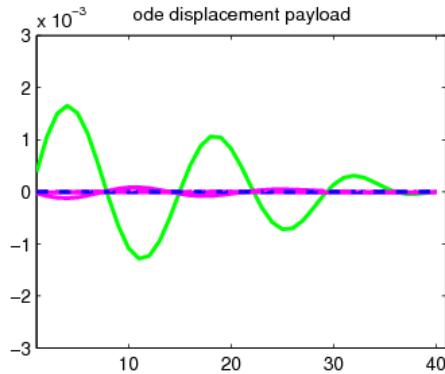
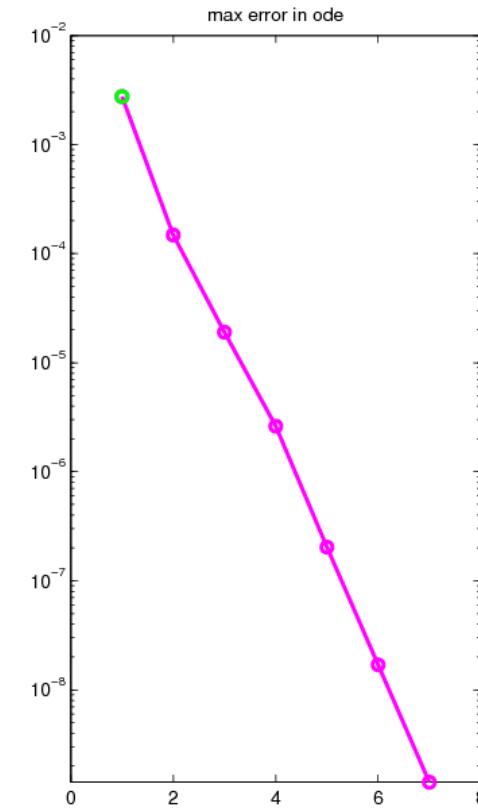
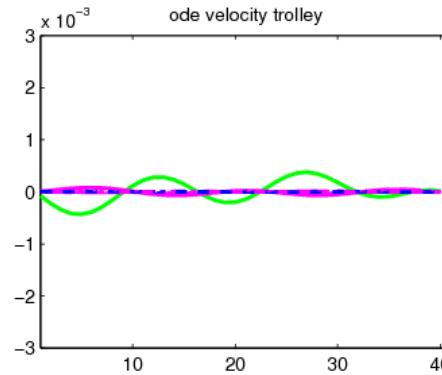
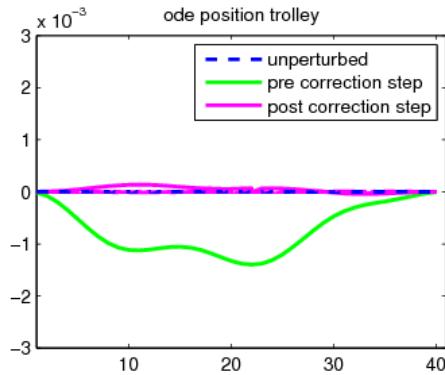
$$u^{[i+1]}(p) = u^{[i]}(p) + \frac{du}{dq}(0) \cdot \Delta q^i \quad x^{[i+1]}(p) = x^{[i]}(p) + \frac{dx}{dq}(0) \cdot \Delta q^i$$

- b. Update deviation,  $i = i + 1$

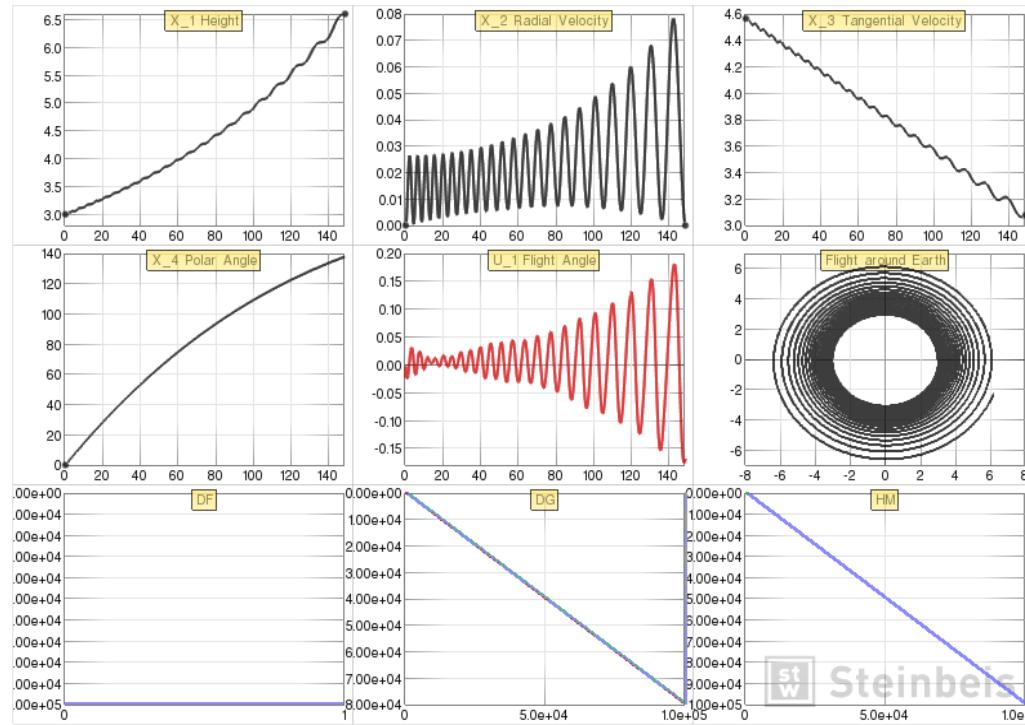

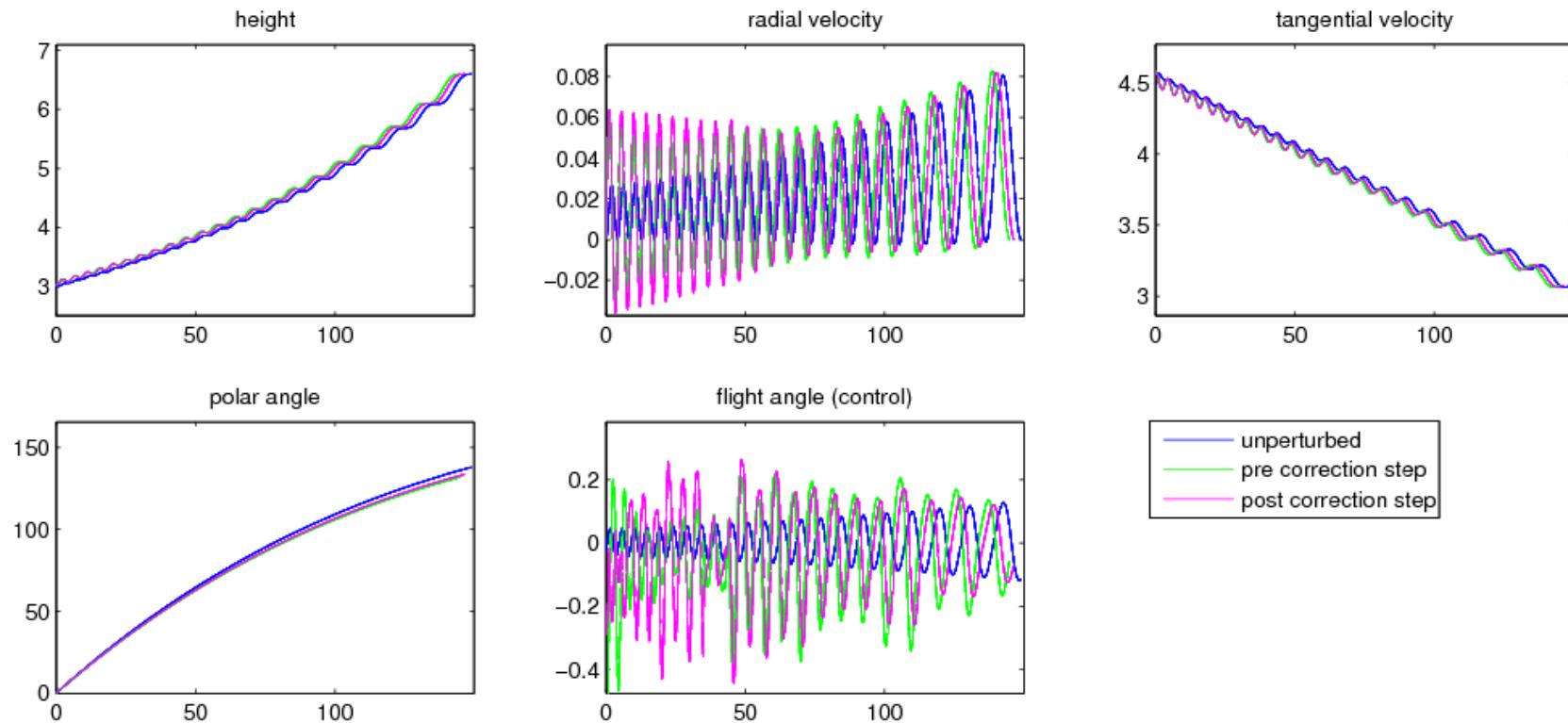

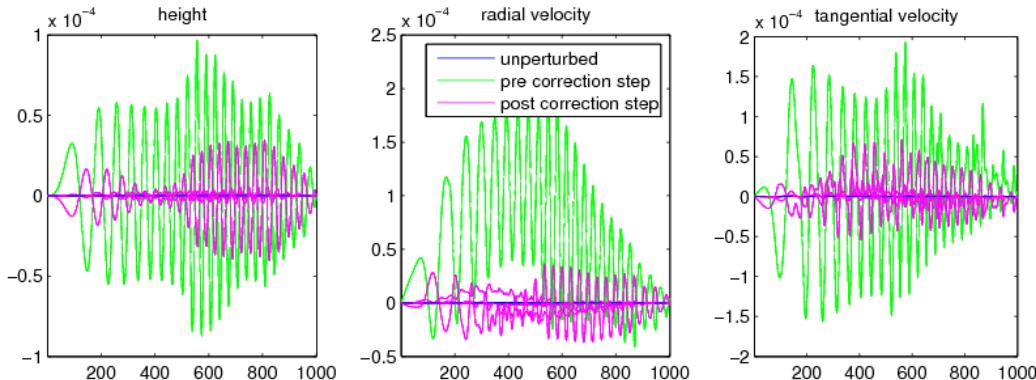
