$$\begin{cases} \partial_t \mathbf{u}(\mathbf{x},t) &= \frac{1}{\rho(\mathbf{x})} \nabla \cdot \underline{\underline{\sigma}}(\mathbf{x},t) \\ \partial_t \underline{\underline{\sigma}}(\mathbf{x},t) &= \lambda(\mathbf{x}) \nabla \cdot \mathbf{u}(\mathbf{x},t) \mathbf{I}_n + \mu(\mathbf{x}) (\nabla \mathbf{u}(\mathbf{x},t) + (\nabla \mathbf{u}(\mathbf{x},t))^T) + f(\mathbf{x},t) \end{cases}$$

Where

- $(\mathbf{x}, t) \in \Omega \times [0, T]$
- ρ is the relative density
- λ is the *P*-Wave modulus
- μ is the shear modulus
- I_n is the identity, n = 2, 3
- f is a source term

Record the entire state $\mathbf{u}_{s}^{i}(t_{n}), n = 0, ..., N - 1$ and access it when needed.



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Computational Cost $\mathcal{O}(N)$, storage Cost $\mathcal{O}(N)$

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Main Steps Optimization of the memory use Example

Computational Cost $\mathcal{O}(N^2)$, Storage Cost $\mathcal{O}(1)$

Main Steps Optimization of the memory use Example

- During the **forward** : Store only a few time steps uⁱ_s(t_n) in buffers called checkpoints
- During the **backward** : Calculate uⁱ_s(t_n) several times from the last checkpoint.



Main Steps Optimization of the memory use Example

Griewank

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Computational Cost $\mathcal{O}(N)$, Storage Cost $\mathcal{O}(N_B)$

Main Steps Optimization of the memory use Example

Analysis of strategies	Strategy 1	Strategy 2	Griewank
CPU time	$\mathcal{O}(N)$	$\mathcal{O}(N^2)$	$\mathcal{O}(N)$
Storage Cost	$\mathcal{O}(N)$	$\mathcal{O}(1)$	$\mathcal{O}(N_B)$

- Dimension : 9500m \times 3000m
- $V_{p_{min}} = 1500 \text{m.s}^{-1}$, $V_{p_{max}} = 5500 \text{m.s}^{-1}$
- Number of shots : 240
- Number of receivers : 96
- Time of the experience : 6 sec
- Claerbout Imaging Condition

$$I(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{i=1}^{n} \int_{0}^{T} \mathbf{U}_{i}^{s}(x, y, t) \mathbf{U}_{r}^{i}(x, y, t)$$

• Storage Strategy: Griewank algorithm

Kernels

Define three Kernels associated to the elastic parameters ρ,μ and κ :

$K_{\rho}(\mathbf{x}), K_{\mu}(\mathbf{x}), K_{\kappa}(\mathbf{x})$

$\mathcal{K}(\mathbf{x}) = \mathcal{K}_{ ho}(\mathbf{x}) + \mathcal{K}_{\mu}(\mathbf{x}) + \mathcal{K}_{\kappa}(\mathbf{x})$

$$\mathcal{K}_{\rho}(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{i=1}^{N} \int_{0}^{T} \rho(\mathbf{x}) \mathbf{u}_{s}^{i}(\mathbf{x}, t) \cdot \mathbf{u}_{r}^{i}(\mathbf{x}, t) dt$$

Tromp's Kernels Results in Elastic

Kernel κ

$$\mathcal{K}_{\kappa}(\mathbf{x}) = -\sum_{i=1}^{n} \int_{0}^{T} \kappa(\mathbf{x}) \left[\nabla \cdot \mathbf{U}_{r}^{i}(\mathbf{x},t) \right] \left[\nabla \cdot \mathbf{U}_{s}^{i}(\mathbf{x},t) \right] dt$$

With :

$$\mathbf{U}_{r}^{i}(\mathbf{x},t) = \int_{0}^{t} \mathbf{u}_{r}^{i}(\mathbf{x},\tau) d\tau$$
$$\mathbf{U}_{s}^{i}(\mathbf{x},t) = \int_{0}^{t} \mathbf{u}_{s}^{i}(\mathbf{x},\tau) d\tau$$

Tromp's Kernels Results in Elastic

Kernel μ

In 2D, we obtain

$$\begin{aligned} \mathcal{K}_{\mu}(\mathbf{x}) &= -\int_{0}^{T} \mu(\mathbf{x}) \Bigg((\nabla \times \mathbf{u}_{s}^{i}) (\nabla \times \mathbf{u}_{r}^{i}) \\ &+ (\nabla \cdot \mathbf{u}_{s}^{i}) (\nabla \cdot \mathbf{u}_{r}^{i}) - 2 \begin{pmatrix} \partial_{x} \mathbf{u}_{sx}^{i} \\ \partial_{y} \mathbf{u}_{sy}^{i} \end{pmatrix} \cdot \begin{pmatrix} \partial_{y} \mathbf{u}_{ry}^{i} \\ \partial_{x} \mathbf{u}_{rx}^{i} \end{pmatrix} \Bigg) dt \end{aligned}$$

2D Square test case



- Square 1000m \times 1000m
- Simulation time : 1 s
- Dirichlet's condition on top
- Boundary y = 500m
- $V_p = 2500_5000 \text{m.s}^{-1}$, $V_s = 1250_2500 \text{m.s}^{-1}$
- Ricker source term : 20Hz
- 30 sources and 30 receivers
