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Signal Processing over Graphs

G = (V, E) a symmetric graph

Adjacency matrix: $A_{ij} = w_{ij}, ij \in E$ Degree matrix: $D = \text{diag}(d_1, \dots, d_N), d_i = \sum_j w_{ij}$ Laplacian matrix: L = D - ANormalized Laplacian: $\mathscr{L} = D^{-1/2}LD^{-1/2}$

$$X: V \to \mathbb{R}$$
 or \mathbb{C} a graph signal

Fourier:
$$F = [\chi_0 \cdots \chi_{N-1}]^*$$
, $\widehat{X} = FX$
Example: $L = F^* \Lambda F$

Why (Non-)Stationarity?

- Stochastic signals
- Toy Example: Denoising
 - \Rightarrow Noise statistical invariance to an absolute time
- Non-stationarity: phase changes
 - \Rightarrow Ruptures, anomalies, failure diagnosis, etc...

Which tools for (non-)stationary graph signals?

Stationary Graph Signals?

• Straightforward definition:

x and $T_{\tau}{x}$ are statistically equal

• Question:

What is T_{τ} ?

- $T_{\tau_i} = \Delta_i$, the Generalized Translation? [Shuman et al. 2013]
- $T_{\tau} = A^{\tau}$, the Graph Shift? [Sandryhaila et al. 2013]
- \Rightarrow These operators are not isometric: $||AX||_2 \neq ||X||_2 \neq ||\Delta_i X||_2$

Definition (Graph Translation) New isometric operator: $T_{\mathscr{Q}}^{\tau} = e^{-\iota\tau\sqrt{L}}$

Remarks

• Coherence with the Time Shift:

$$T_{\tau}\{e_{\omega}\} = e^{-\iota\tau\omega}e_{\omega} \implies T_{\mathcal{G}}^{\tau}\chi_{I} = e^{-\iota\tau\sqrt{\lambda_{I}}}\chi_{I}$$
$$\widehat{T_{\mathcal{G}}^{\tau}} = \operatorname{diag}(e^{-\iota\sqrt{\lambda_{0}}}, \dots, e^{-\iota\sqrt{\lambda_{N-1}}})$$

• Supports alternative graph Fourier transforms:

•
$$T_{\mathscr{G}}^{\tau} = e^{-\iota\tau\sqrt{\mathscr{L}}}$$

- Complex operator
 - Not a real problem for stationarity
 - Analytical signals?

 $f_{\mathscr{G}}$ is NOT an operator *shifting* energy from one vertex to another.

Definition of Stationary Graph Signals [Eusipco 2015]

Definition (SSS Graph Signal)

A stochastic graph signal X verifying $\forall \tau, X \stackrel{d}{=} T^{\tau}_{\mathscr{Q}} X$.

Definition (WSS Graph Signal)

A stochastic graph signal X is Wide Sense Stationary iff:

$$\begin{array}{ll} \mu_X = & \mathbb{E}[X] & = \mathbb{E}[\mathcal{T}_{\mathscr{G}}X] & = \mu_{\mathcal{T}_{\mathscr{G}}X} \\ R_X = & \mathbb{E}[XX^*] & = \mathbb{E}[(\mathcal{T}_{\mathscr{G}}X)(\mathcal{T}_{\mathscr{G}}X)^*] & = R_{\mathcal{T}_{\mathscr{G}}X} \end{array}$$

Spectral Characterisation [Eusipco 2015]

Theorem

A stochastic graph signal X is WSS iff

$$\forall I, \lambda_{I} \neq 0 \Rightarrow \mathbb{E}[\widehat{X}(I)] = 0$$

$$\forall I, \lambda_{I} \neq \lambda_{k} \Rightarrow \mathbb{E}[\widehat{X}(I)\widehat{X}^{*}(k)] = 0$$

Remark on (i) (First Moment)

First moment condition: $\mathbb{E}[X] \propto \chi_0$ (DC Component)

•
$$L = F^* \Lambda F \Rightarrow \chi_0 = [1, \dots, 1]$$

•
$$\mathscr{L} = F^* \Lambda F \Rightarrow \chi_0 = \left[1/\sqrt{d_1}, \dots, 1/\sqrt{d_N} \right]^T$$

Remark on (ii) (Second Moment)

- uncorrelated frequency components
- if $\forall l \neq k, \lambda_l \neq \lambda_k$, then (ii) $\Leftrightarrow S = \mathbb{E}[\widehat{X}\widehat{X}^*]$ diagonal

Stationary White Noise on Graph

Signal with flat power spectrum:

$$S = \mathbb{E}[\widehat{X}\widehat{X}^*] = \sigma^2 I$$





WSS Graph Signal



Non Stationary Graph Signal

Same as previously, with additive noise on X(1) with distribution $\mathcal{N}(0,1)$.





Molène Dataset and Data Pre-processing

Temperatures of January 2014 in Brittany 25 ground stations, 744 snapshots Weights: $w_{ij} = \exp(d(i,j)^2/2\sigma^2)$

Question: Stationary Graph Signal?



Mean Temperatures





Temperature: IMF1

Temperature Correlations



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Temperature Correlations

 $X_i(t)$: IMF1 at vertex i X(t): realisation of **X**

Question: Is **X** stationary?

Correlation coefficient:

$$c(x,y) = \frac{\mathbb{E}[xy^*]}{\sigma_x \sigma_y}$$
