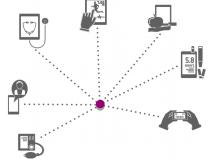

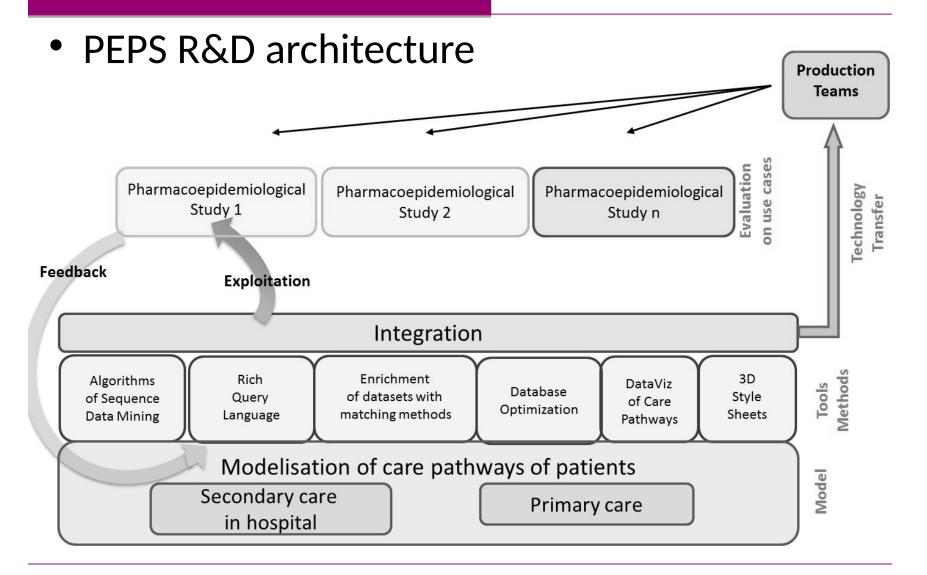
- Pharmaco-epidemiology consists in investigating impacts and uses (or misuses) of drugs in real conditions
- Large medico-administrative databases offer new perspectives
 - Data from drugs uses in real conditions
 - Nationwide available data
 - Perspective: answer in a short time pharmaco-epidemiological queries for national public health institutions
- but also huge challenges
 - Incomplete, complex and massive data
 - Connection with other data sources (eHR, Cepi-DC, etc.)
- Our objective: conception of a generic digital toolbox to support the efficient design of a broad range of pharmaco-epidemiology studies from EHR databases



PEPS project

- Exploits, in secondary use, the French health crossschemes insurance system, called SNIIRAM
 - most of the French population with a sliding period of 3 past years
- Two main activities
 - Pharmaco-epidemiological studies program
 - Objective of 4 to 6 studies per year
 - Research & development program
 - Modeling of care pathways
 - Design of tools supporting meaningful insights extraction
- A multi-disciplinary team: clinicians, epidemiologists, data scientists, computer scientists,
- Funded by French Agency for Medicines and Health Products Safety (2015-2018)

R&D results

- Care pathway model
 - make easier the access to SNIIRAM data warehouse
 - Similar objective to OMOP (Observational Medical Outcome Partnership)
- Development of new technologies querying care pathways
 - High level query language for manipulating and querying care pathways data
 - Semantic web for flexible and extensible data querying
- New data analysis tools for providing original insights
 - Care pathway mining tools
 - Data visualisation tools
