SDCurve.js A JavaScript Library for Interactive Subdivision Curves

PURPOSE

SDCurve.js is a curve library that makes it easy to **interact** with curves.

Once created, no knowledge of the underlying control points is needed to freely manipulate the curve, making it well-suited to interactive visualizations.

SDCurve.js supports B-spline curves of any degree, Catmull-Rom interpolating curves, open and closed curves, and more. Because SDCurves provide access to the curve structure, they can also be used to perform more complicated tasks, such as animating objects along

INTERACTIVE



SHARP & SMOOTH CHANGES

Adjust parameters of your curve to make interactive manipulations sharper or smoother.







LASSO SELECTION

A freeform lasso selection can be altered on the fly using both sharp and smooth changes. The curve updates only in the local area of change to improve performance, and intersection or containment tests can be performed on the curve object.



WHAT IS SUBDIVISION?

Subdivision operates on control points, refining them iteratively until obtaining a smooth curve. Many common curve schemes can be represented using subdivision.
