High-performance computing and big data are two main areas where NPC 2017 provided a dynamic forum to explore, discuss, and debate state-of-the-art technology issues and challenges. High-performance computers and big-data systems are tied inextricably to the broader computing ecosystem and its designs and market adoption. They also highlight information security needs and economic competitiveness in ways that distinguish them from most other scientific instruments.
