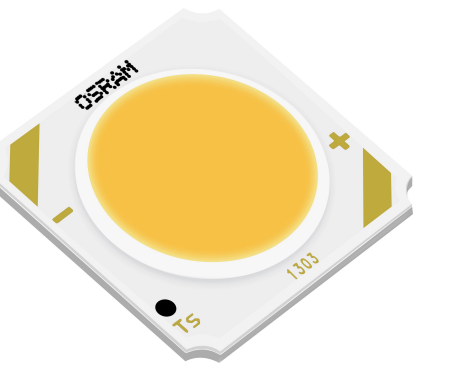

- Propose an efficient communication protocol at the MAC layer to take into account the integration of VLC objects

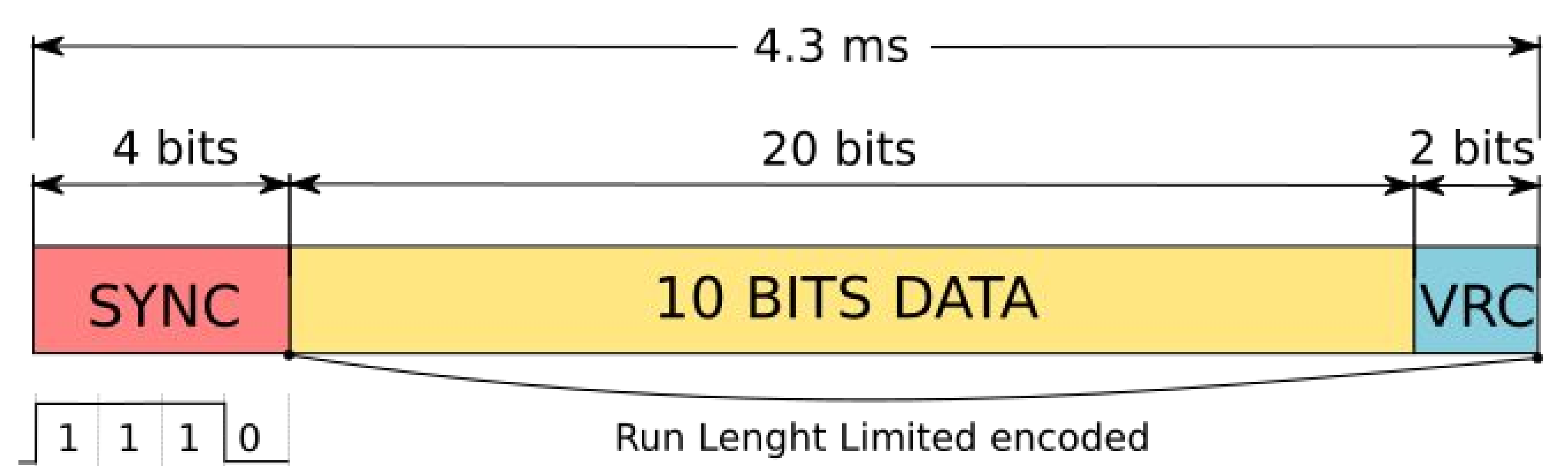


LEDs as Emitter

- Driven by cheap MCU

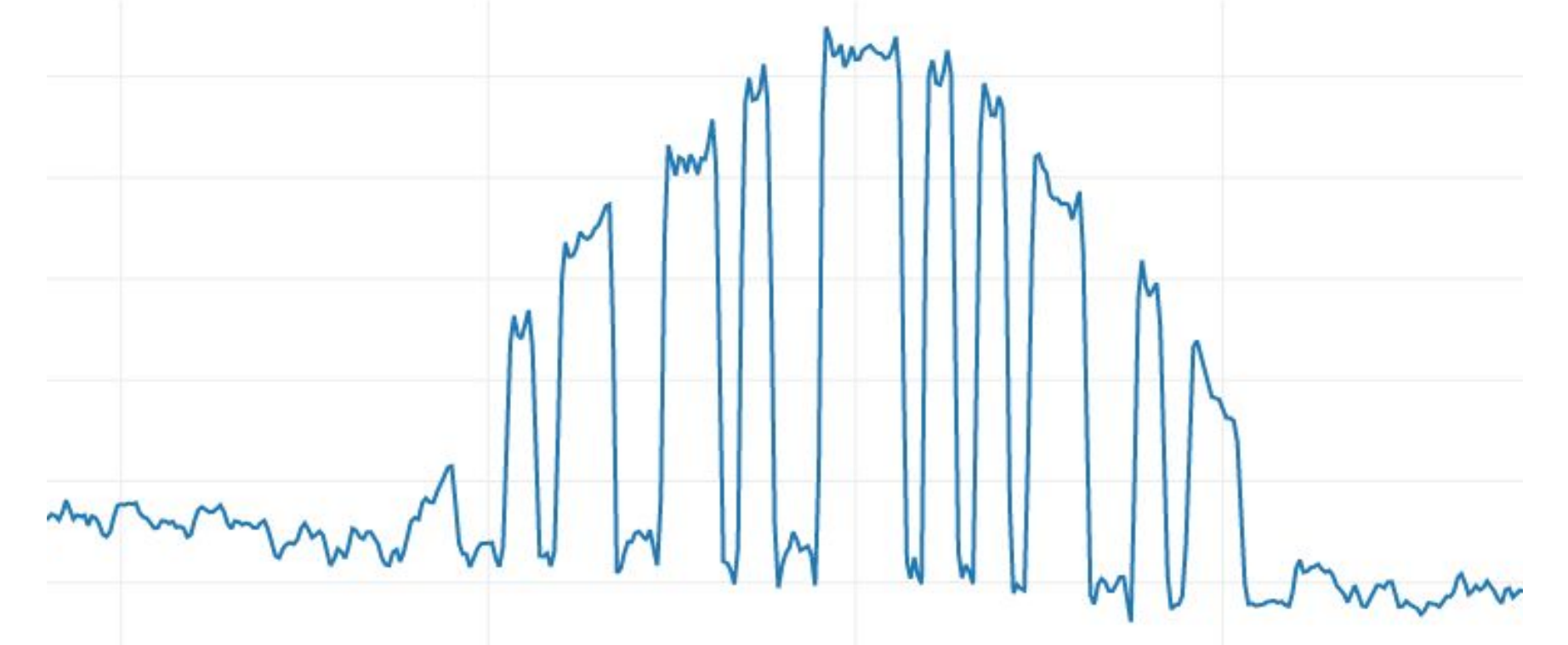
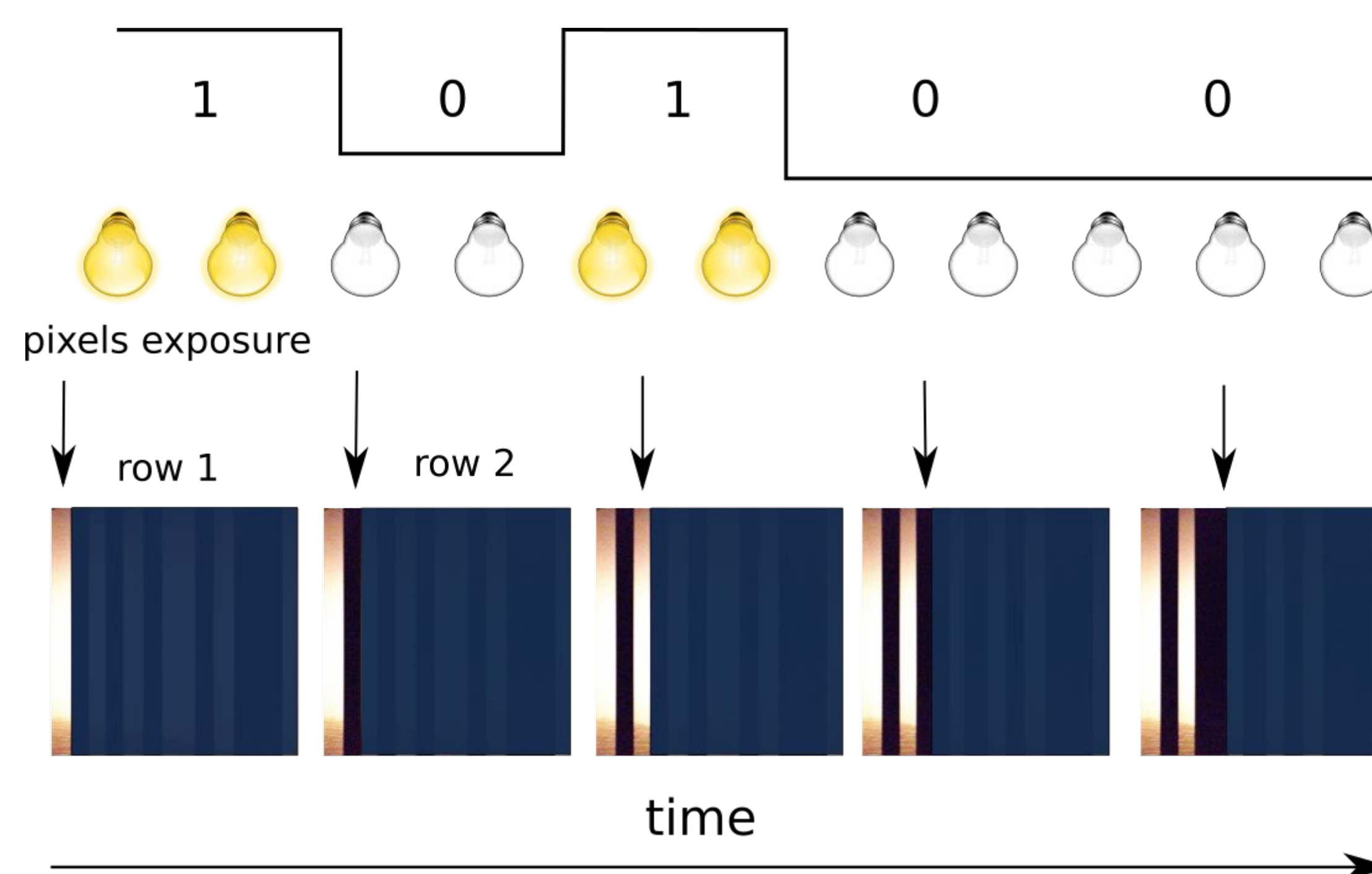
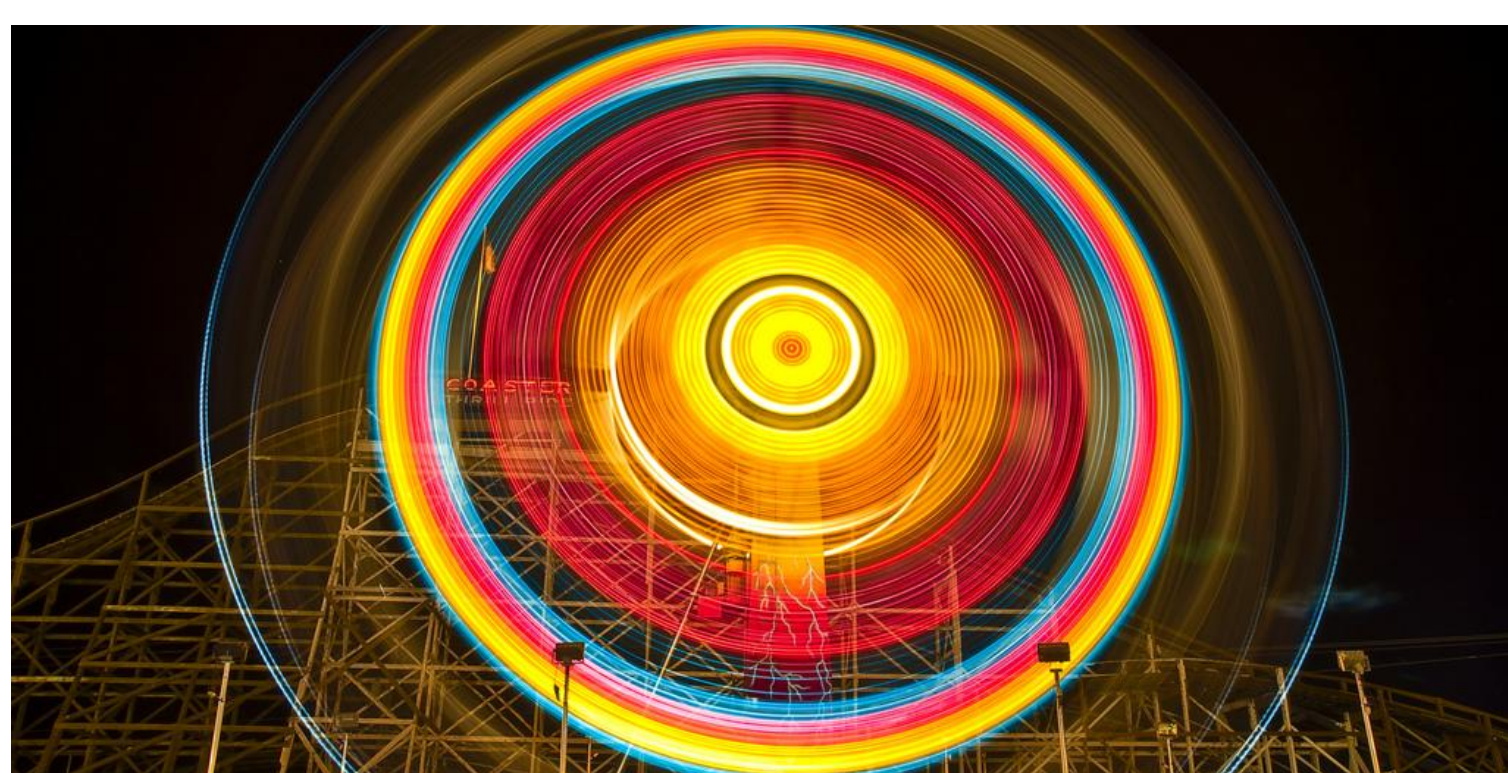
PHY Layer

- 500-4000 bit/s



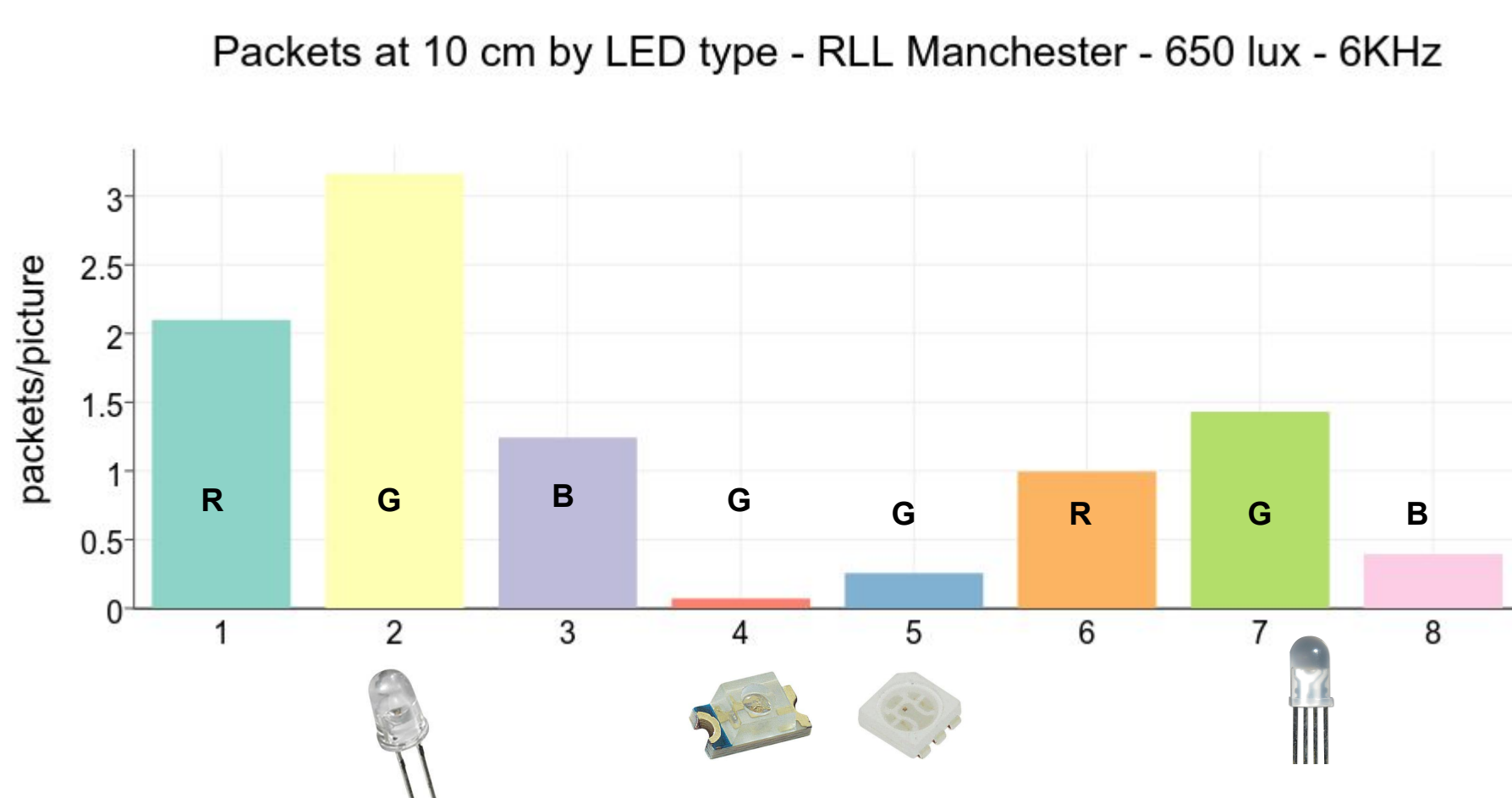
Smartphone as receiver

- Rolling Shutter Effect

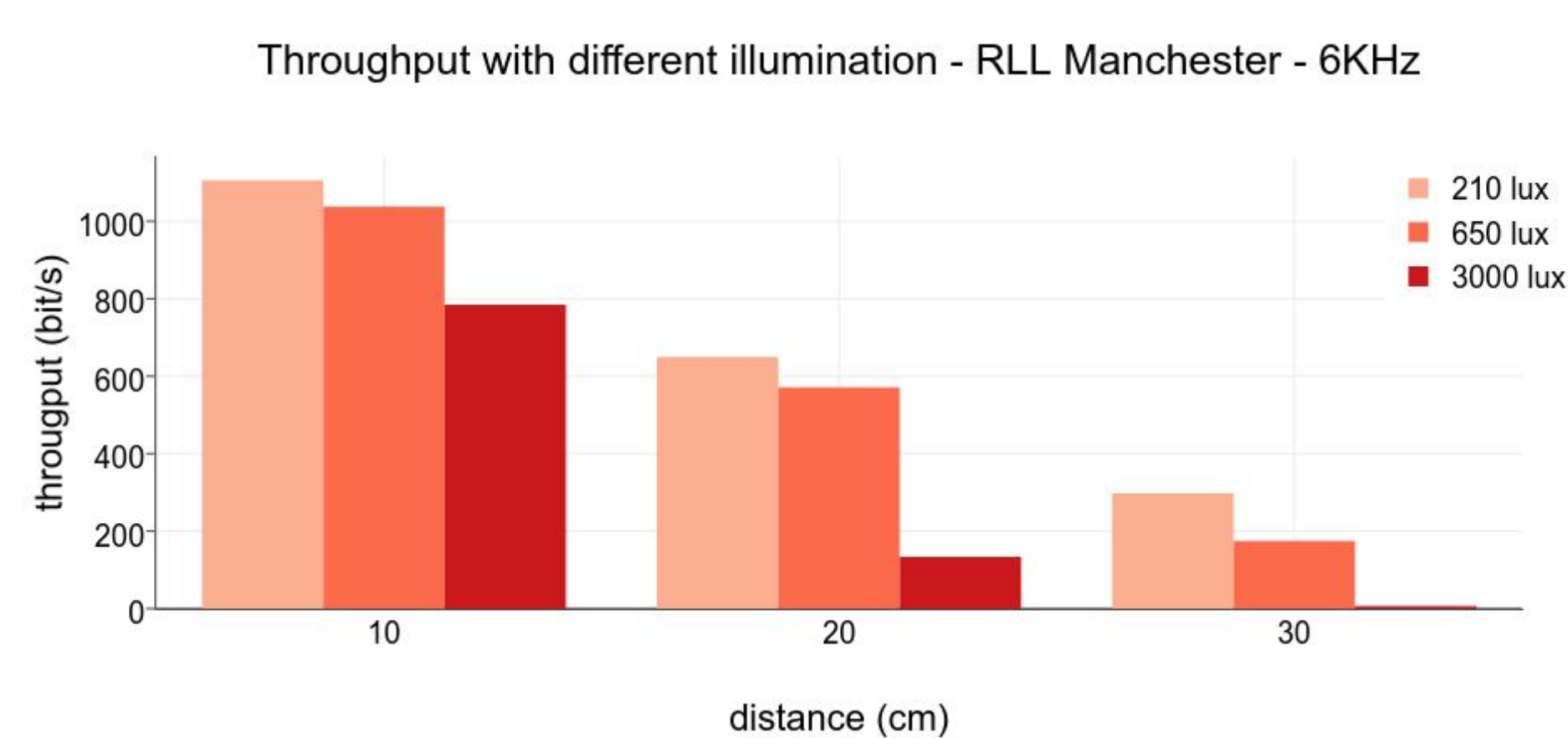

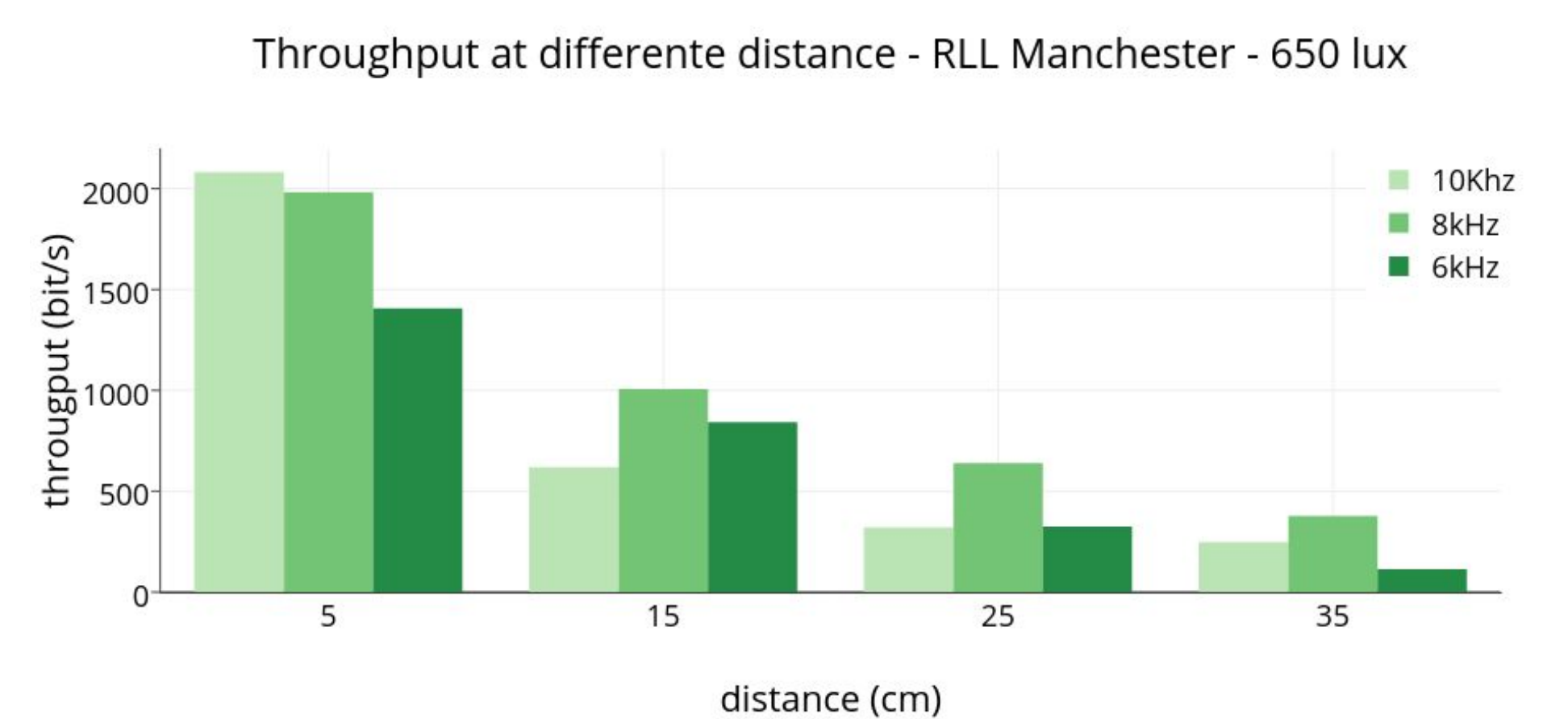
LED type & color impact



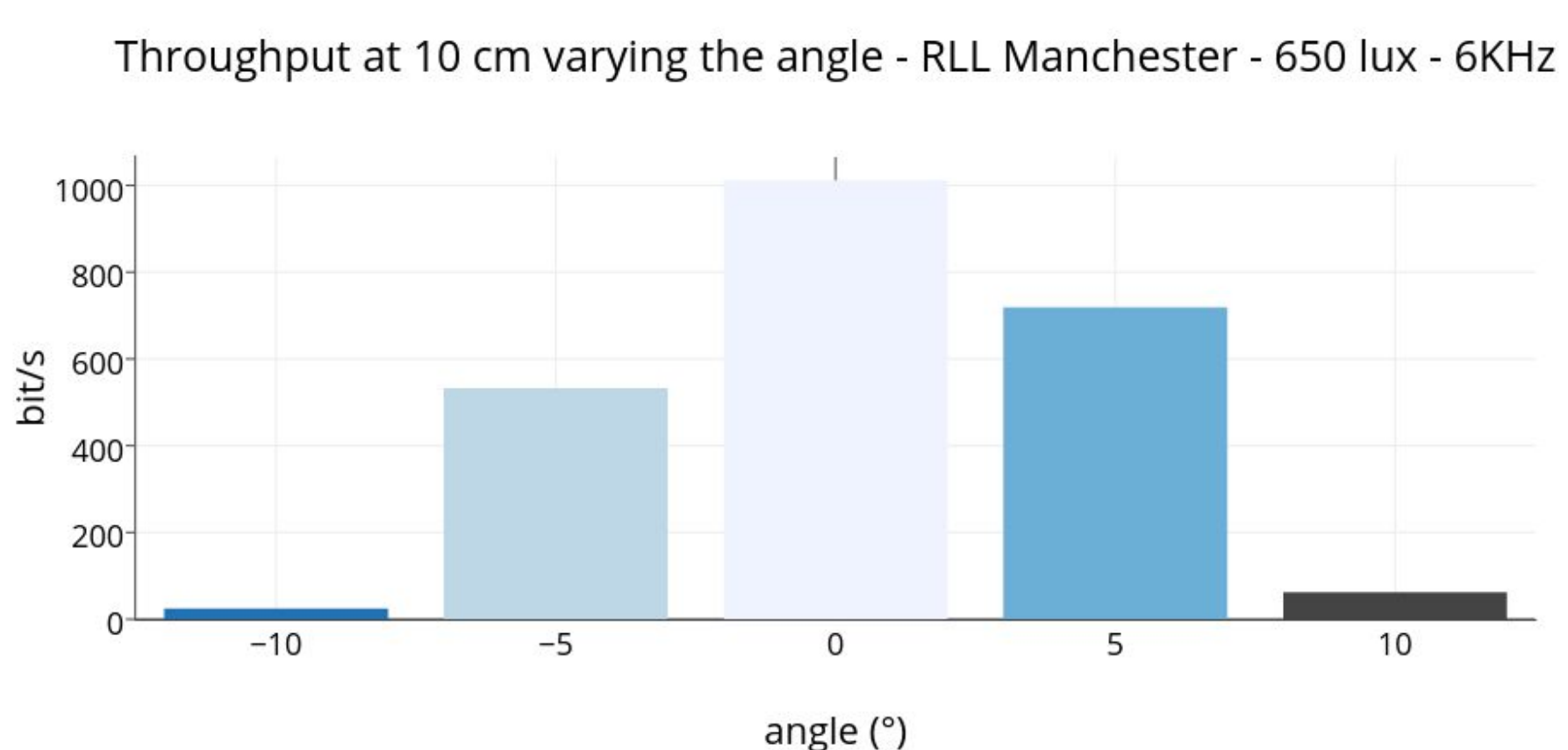
Illumination impact



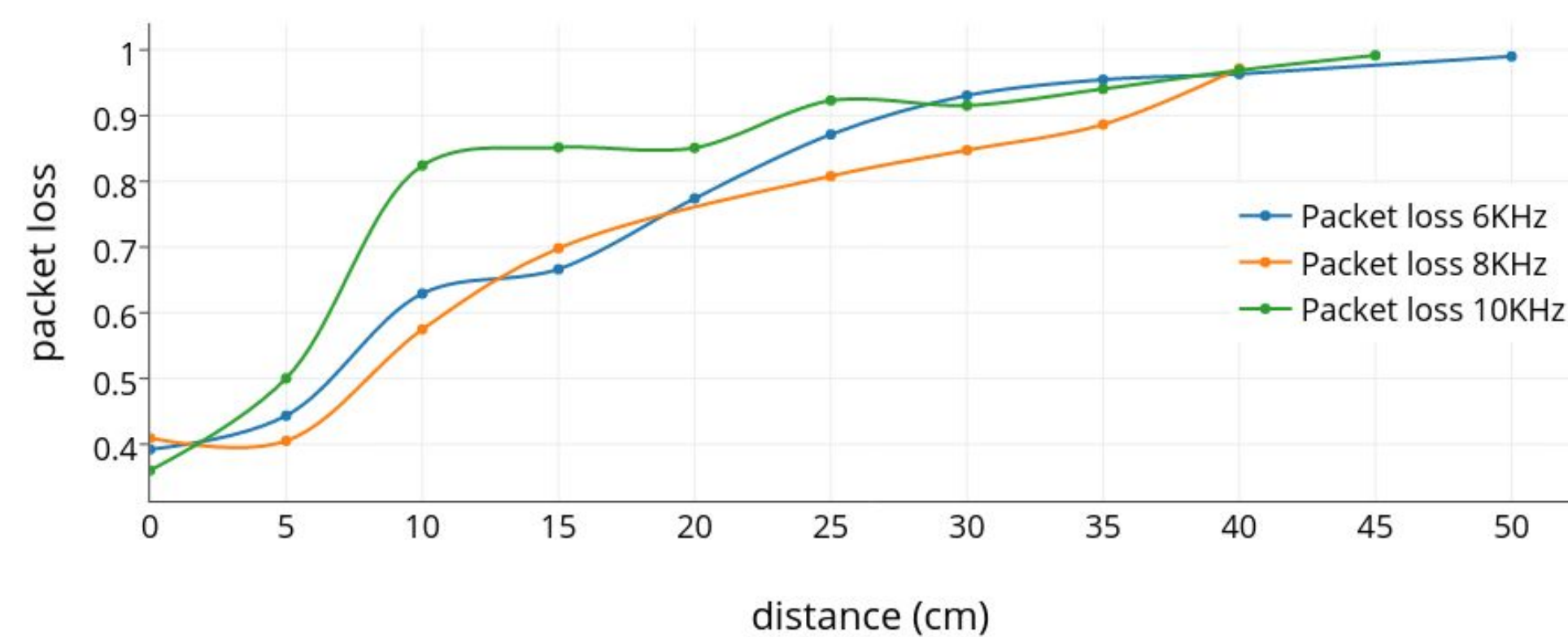
Achieved throughput



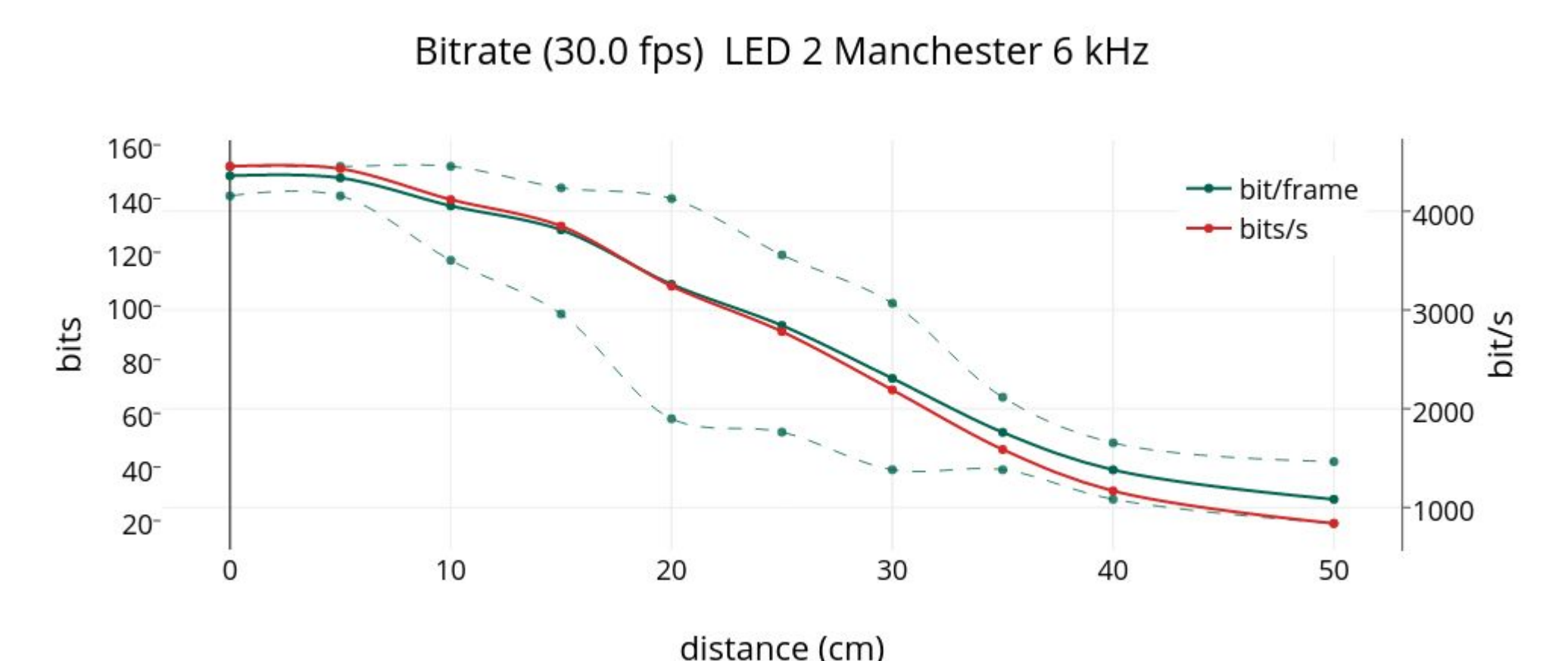
Angle impact
