Asymptotic assumption : $\delta \ll \lambda$

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Model Problem



- Time-harmonic domain
- Homogeneous & isotropic medium Ω_{δ}
- Perfect conductors $\mathcal{B}(c_k, \delta)$, $_{k = 1...N_{obs}}$

Mathematical well-posedness [Phillips (1973)]

For any $\mathbf{E}^{\text{inc}} \in \mathbf{H}_{\text{loc}}(\mathbf{curl}, \Omega_{\delta})$ there exist a unique solution $(\mathbf{E}_{\delta}, \mathbf{H}_{\delta}) \in \mathbf{H}_{\text{loc}}(\mathbf{curl}, \Omega_{\delta})^2$ to the exterior Maxwell problem.

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Born Approximation

$$\mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{Born}}_{\delta}(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{k=1}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) \qquad \qquad \mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{Born}}_{\delta}(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{k=1}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{H}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x})$$

• Each obstacle is modeled as a dipolar source around ck

$$\begin{split} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) &= \mathcal{E}_{dip}^{elec}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{E}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) + \mathcal{E}_{dip}^{mag}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{H}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) \\ \mathbf{H}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) &= \mathcal{H}_{dip}^{elec}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{E}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) + \mathcal{H}_{dip}^{mag}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{H}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) \end{split}$$

Case of perfectly conducting spheres

3-order approximation

$$\mathbf{d}^{\scriptscriptstyle \mathsf{E}}_{\delta,k} = 4\pi\delta^3\mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_k) \quad \mathbf{d}^{\scriptscriptstyle \mathsf{H}}_{\delta,k} = -2\pi\delta^3\mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_k)$$

Corrected dipolar approximation

$$\begin{split} \mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{E}} &= 4\pi\delta^3 \Big(1 + \frac{3(\kappa\delta)^2}{10} \Big) \mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_k) \\ \mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{H}} &= -2\pi\delta^3 \Big(1 - \frac{3(\kappa\delta)^2}{5} \Big) \mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_k) \end{split}$$

Important restrictions

- Very small obstacles
- Small number of obstacles
- No interaction taken into account

Foldy-Lax Approximation

$$\mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{Foldy}}_{\delta}(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{k=1}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) \qquad \qquad \mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{Foldy}}_{\delta}(\mathbf{x}) = \sum_{k=1}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{H}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x})$$

Each obstacle is modeled as a dipolar source around ck

$$\begin{split} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) &= \mathcal{E}_{dip}^{elec}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{E}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) + \mathcal{E}_{dip}^{mag}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{H}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) \\ \mathbf{H}_{\delta,k}(\mathbf{x}) &= \mathcal{H}_{dip}^{elec}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{E}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) + \mathcal{H}_{dip}^{mag}[\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{H}](\mathbf{x} - \mathbf{c}_{k}) \end{split}$$

Case of perfectly conducting spheres

3-order approximation

$$\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{E}} = 4\pi\delta^{3} \Big(\mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{inc}}(\mathbf{C}_{k}) + \sum_{\substack{\ell=1\\ \ell \neq k}}^{\mathsf{N}_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,\ell}(\mathbf{C}_{k}) \Big) \quad \mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{H}} = -2\pi\delta^{3} \Big(\mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{inc}}(\mathbf{C}_{k}) + \sum_{\substack{\ell=1\\ \ell \neq k}}^{\mathsf{N}_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{H}_{\delta,\ell}(\mathbf{C}_{k}) \Big)$$

Corrected dipolar approximation

$$\mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{E}} = 4\pi\delta^{3}\Big(1 + \frac{3(\kappa\delta)^{2}}{10}\Big)\Big(\mathbf{E}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_{k}) + \sum_{\substack{\ell=1\\\ell\neq k}}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{E}_{\delta,\ell}(c_{k})\Big) \quad \mathbf{d}_{\delta,k}^{\mathsf{H}} = -2\pi\delta^{3}\Big(1 - \frac{3(\kappa\delta)^{2}}{5}\Big)\Big(\mathbf{H}^{\mathsf{inc}}(c_{k}) + \sum_{\substack{\ell=1\\\ell\neq k}}^{N_{\mathsf{obs}}} \mathbf{H}_{\delta,\ell}(c_{k})\Big)$$
