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# Linear approximations

# Linear approximations

$$\Pr[lpha \cdot x + eta \cdot F(x) = 0]$$
 far from  $rac{1}{2}$ 

# quantified by:

$$\mathrm{cor}_F(lpha,eta)=2^{-n}\sum_{x\in\mathbb{F}_2^n}(-1)^{lpha\cdot x+eta\cdot F(x)}$$

since

$$\Pr[lpha \cdot x + eta \cdot F(x) = 0] = rac{1}{2} \left(1 + \mathrm{cor}_F(lpha, eta)
ight)$$

# Linear approximations with correlation $\pm 1$

F has a linear approximation with correlation  $\pm 1$  iff it has a component of degree 1.

 $\Rightarrow$  This never occurs for one-round SPN (except for trivial Sboxes)

An alternative formulation:

$$\mathrm{cor}_F(lpha,eta)=-1+2^{-n+2}\#\{x\in\langlelpha
angle^\perp$$
 such that  $F(x)\in\langleeta
angle^\perp\}$ 

$$\Rightarrow \operatorname{cor}_F(\alpha,\beta) = \pm 1$$
 iff  $F(\langle \alpha \rangle^{\perp}) = \langle \beta \rangle^{\perp}$  or  $\mathbb{F}_2^n \setminus \langle \beta \rangle^{\perp}$ .

Linear approximations over several rounds [Daemen 95][Nyberg 01]

$$\mathrm{cor}_{G\circ F}(lpha,eta) = \sum_{oldsymbol{\gamma}\in\mathbb{F}_2^n}\mathrm{cor}_F(lpha,oldsymbol{\gamma})\mathrm{cor}_G(oldsymbol{\gamma},eta)\;.$$

If one dominant trail  $(\alpha, \gamma_0, \beta)$ :

$$\operatorname{cor}_{G \circ F}(\alpha, \beta) \simeq \operatorname{cor}_F(\alpha, \gamma_0) \operatorname{cor}_G(\gamma_0, \beta)$$
.

Otherwise, linear hull effect.

#### For a two-round SPN

$$\mathrm{cor}_{L\circ S}(lpha,eta) = \sum_{\gamma\in\mathbb{F}_2^n}\mathrm{cor}_S(lpha,\gamma)\,\mathrm{cor}_L(\gamma,eta) = \mathrm{cor}_S(lpha,L^T(eta))\;.$$

$$\mathrm{cor}_{\mathcal{R}\circ\mathsf{Add}_k\circ\mathcal{R}}(lpha,eta) = \sum_{oldsymbol{\gamma}\in\mathbb{F}_2^n} (-1)^{k\cdotoldsymbol{\gamma}} \mathrm{cor}_S(lpha,L^T(oldsymbol{\gamma})) \mathrm{cor}_S(oldsymbol{\gamma},L^T(eta)) \;.$$

Question: can we get a correlation  $\pm 1$  for a two-round approximation for some fixed k?

# **Nonlinear approximations**

Let g and h be two balanced Boolean functions of n variables.

$$\Pr[oldsymbol{g}(x)+oldsymbol{h}(F(x))=0]$$
 far from  $rac{1}{2}.$ 

quantified by:

$$\mathrm{cor}_F(oldsymbol{g},oldsymbol{h}) = 2^{-n}\sum_{x\in\mathbb{F}_2^n} (-1)^{oldsymbol{g}(x)+oldsymbol{h}(F(x))}$$

Non-trivial partition of  $\mathbb{F}_2^n$  invariant under F:



 ${old S}$ : any subset of  $\mathbb{F}_2^n$  $F({old S})={old S}$ or  $F({old S})=\mathbb{F}_2^n\setminus{old S}$  Non-trivial partition of  $\mathbb{F}_2^n$  invariant under F:



# **Equivalently:**

Let g be the Boolean function defined by g(x):=1 iff  $x\in \mathcal{S}$ 

 $\forall x \in \mathbb{F}_2^n, g(F(x)) = g(x) \text{ or } \forall x \in \mathbb{F}_2^n, g(F(x)) = g(x) + 1$ 

Such a g is called an invariant for F.

# Nonlinear approximations with correlation $\pm 1$

# $m{g}$ is an invariant for $m{F}$ if and only if

$$\operatorname{cor}_F(\boldsymbol{g}, \boldsymbol{g}) = 2^{-n} \sum_{x \in \mathbb{F}_2^n} (-1)^{\boldsymbol{g}(x) + \boldsymbol{g}(F(x))} = \pm 1$$

## Nonlinear approximations as a combination of linear approximations

$$\mathrm{cor}_F(g,h) = \sum_{oldsymbol{\gamma},oldsymbol{\gamma}'\in\mathbb{F}_2^n} \mathrm{cor}_g(oldsymbol{\gamma}) \,\mathrm{cor}_F(oldsymbol{\gamma},oldsymbol{\gamma}') \,\mathrm{cor}_h(oldsymbol{\gamma}') \;.$$

If 
$$g = \ell_{lpha}$$
 and  $h = \ell_{eta}$ , then

$$\operatorname{cor}_F(g,h) = \operatorname{cor}_F(\alpha,\beta)$$
 .

Otherwise, we gather together several linear approximations.

#### Transforming nonlinear invariants into linear approximations

Let g be a balanced nonlinear invariant for F.

We can always define a permutation  ${\cal G}$  such that  $\alpha \cdot {\cal G}(x) = g(x).$ Then,

$$egin{array}{rll} g(x)+g(F(x))&=&lpha\cdot \mathcal{G}(x)+lpha\cdot (\mathcal{G}\circ F)(x)\ &=&lpha\cdot y+lpha\cdot (\mathcal{G}\circ F\circ \mathcal{G}^{-1})(y) \end{array}$$

The nonlinear approximation of F defined by (g,g) corresponds to the linear approximation  $(\alpha, \alpha)$  of  $F^{\mathcal{G}, \mathcal{G}^{-1}} = \mathcal{G} \circ F \circ \mathcal{G}^{-1}$ .

$$\operatorname{cor}_{F^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}}(lpha, lpha) = \sum_{\gamma_1, \gamma_2 \in \mathbb{F}_2^n} \operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{G}_{oldsymbol{lpha}}}(\gamma_1) \operatorname{cor}_F(\gamma_1, \gamma_2) \operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{G}_{oldsymbol{lpha}}}(\gamma_2)$$

The other components of  $\mathcal{G}$  do not matter!

# $\mathcal{G}$ -shifted trails

$$egin{aligned} E^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}_{(k_0,\ldots,k_t)} &= & \mathcal{G}\circ\mathcal{R}_{k_t}\circ\mathcal{R}_{k_{t-1}}\circ\cdots\circ\mathcal{R}_{k_0}\circ\mathcal{G}^{-1}\ &= & \mathcal{R}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}_{k_t}\circ\mathcal{R}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}_{k_{t-1}}\circ\cdots\circ\mathcal{R}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}_{k_0}. \end{aligned}$$

$$\mathrm{cor}_{E^{{\mathcal{G}},{\mathcal{G}}-1}_{(k_0,...,k_t)}}(lpha,eta) = \sum_{\gamma_1,...,\gamma_{t-1}\in \mathbb{F}_2^n}\prod_{i=0}^{t-1}\mathrm{cor}_{\mathcal{R}^{{\mathcal{G}},{\mathcal{G}}-1}_{k_i}}(\gamma_i,\gamma_{i+1}) \;.$$

#### A one-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64

 $\mathcal{G}=(G,\ldots,G)$  where G is a bijection on 4 bits such that  $\langle 8,G(x)
angle=g(x)$  with  $g(x)=x_3x_2+x_2+x_1+x_0$  invariant for the Sbox, i.e.

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{S^{G,G^{-1}}(8,8)}| = 1$$
.  
 $|\operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{M}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}((8,\ldots,8),(8,\ldots,8))}| = 1$ .

 $\Rightarrow$  Iterative one-round trail with correlation  $\pm 1$ :



# A two-round shifted trail on Midori-64 [Beyne 18]

For 
$$g(x)=x_0x_2+x_0+x_1+x_3$$
 and  $lpha=$  0x5, the Sbox satisfies  $g(S(x))+lpha\cdot x=1$  .

We choose a 4-bit bijection G such that  $\langle 8,G(x)
angle=g(x).$  Equivalently,

$$\mathrm{cor}_S(\ell_lpha,g) = \mathrm{cor}_{G \circ S}(lpha,8) = -1$$
 .

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{M}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}}((8,\ldots,8),(8,\ldots,8))| = 1.$$

# A two-round shifted trail on Midori-64 [Beyne 18]



This is a two-round linear approximation with correlation  $\pm 1!$ 

#### A 4-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64

G is a bijection on 4 bits such that  $\langle 8, G(x) \rangle = g(x)$ with  $g(x) = x_3 x_2 x_1 + x_3 x_1 + x_3 + x_2 + x_1 + x_0$  invariant for the Sbox:

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{S^{G,G^{-1}}(8,8)}| = 1$$
 .

But,

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{\mathrm{M}^{\mathrm{G},\mathrm{G}^{-1}}}\left(lpha,\mathrm{M}lpha
ight)|=rac{11}{32}$$

if  $\alpha \neq (0, 0, 0, 0)$  and all  $\alpha_i \in \{0, 8\}$ .

# A 4-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64



## A 4-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64

The weak keys are those equal to 0 or 1 in all active cells.

**Correlation of the trail:** 

$$\left(rac{11}{32}
ight)^8 = 2^{-12.325}$$

**Correlation of the approximation:** 

$$\operatorname{cor}_{(\mathcal{R}_{k_3} \circ \dots \mathcal{R}_{k_0})^{\mathcal{G}, \mathcal{G}^{-1}}(\alpha, \alpha)} \simeq 2^{-12.16}$$

What's about the other trails? For the first 2 rounds:

- For  $G_1 = [0, 8, c, 4, a, 2, 6, e, 9, 1, d, 5, 3, b, f, 7]$ , 35,937  $\mathcal{G}_1$ -shifted linear trails having a nonzero correlation
- For  $G_2 = [0, 9, a, 1, 8, 2, 3, f, c, 4, d, 5, 6, e, b, 7]$ , 282,184  $\mathcal{G}_2$ -shifted linear trails having a nonzero correlation

 $\mathcal{G} = (G', G, \dots, G)$  where G is a bijection on 4 bits such that  $\langle 8, G(x) \rangle = g(x)$  with  $g(x) = x_3x_2 + x_2 + x_1 + x_0$  invariant for S,  $\langle 8, G'(x) \rangle = g'(x)$  with  $g'(x) = x_3x_2x_1 + x_3x_1 + x_3 + x_2 + x_1 + x_0$ .

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{S_k^{G',G'^{-1}}(8,8)}| = egin{cases} 1 & ext{if } k \in \{0,1\} \ 2^{-1} & ext{if } k 
otin \{0,1\} \end{cases}$$

$$|\operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{M}^{\mathcal{G},\mathcal{G}^{-1}}}((8,\ldots,8),(8,\ldots,8))| \simeq 2^{-0.83}$$

# Another 1-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64



**Correlation of the 16-round trail:** 

$$\geq \left(2^{-1.83}\right)^{16} = 2^{-29.28}$$

# Another 1-round *G*-shifted trail on Midori-64



Correlation of the 16-round trail:

$$\geq \left(2^{-1.83}\right)^{16} = 2^{-29.28}$$

#### **Correlation over 16 rounds:**

different from the correlation of the trail.

#### Focus on a single column

$$\begin{aligned} \mathcal{G} &= (G', G, G, G) \text{ with} \\ &| \operatorname{cor}_{S_k^{G', G'^{-1}}(8, 8)} | = \begin{cases} 1 & \text{if } k \in \{0, 1\} \\ 2^{-1} & \text{if } k \notin \{0, 1\} \end{cases} \\ &| \operatorname{cor}_{\mathbf{M}^{\mathcal{G}, \mathcal{G}^{-1}}} ((8, 8, 8, 8), (8, 8, 8, 8)) | = 2^{-0.83} \end{aligned}$$



If 
$$k_1 \in \left(\mathbb{F}_2^4 \setminus \{(0,0,*,*)\}\right) \times \{(0,0,*,*)\}^3,$$
  
 $\operatorname{cor}_{\mathcal{R}_{k_1} \circ \mathcal{R}_{k_0}} ((8,8,8,8),(8,8,8,8)) = 0$ 

# **Open problems**

- When can we approximate the correlation with a single trail?
- Nonlinear approximations as a method for clustering linear approximations to capture the linear hull effect?
  - How general is this?
  - How can we find the appropriate approximation?
