Why consistent model ?



Both scales must respect appreciate physical laws



Losing consistency may provide wrong statistics

Location Uncertainty Principles (Mémin 2014; Resseguier et al. 2017)

Stochastic flow :

$$\mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{X}_t = \boldsymbol{u}(\boldsymbol{X}_t, t)\mathrm{d}t + \boldsymbol{\sigma}(\boldsymbol{X}_t, t)\mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{B}_t$$

large-scale resolved small-scale unresolved

Functional process :

$$\boldsymbol{\sigma}(\boldsymbol{x},t)\mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{B}_{t} = \int_{D} \boldsymbol{\breve{\sigma}}(\boldsymbol{x},\boldsymbol{y},t)\mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{B}_{t}(\boldsymbol{y})\mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{y}$$

correlated in space uncorrelated in time *symmetric space-time kernel white noise*

Variance tensor :

$$\boldsymbol{a} \stackrel{\scriptscriptstyle \Delta}{=} \boldsymbol{\sigma} \boldsymbol{\sigma}^{T} = \mathbb{E} \big[\boldsymbol{\sigma} \mathrm{d} \boldsymbol{B}_{t} (\boldsymbol{\sigma} \mathrm{d} \boldsymbol{B}_{t})^{T} \big] / \mathrm{d} t$$

homogeneous / heterogeneous

• Transport of a random tracer :

$$(\nabla \cdot \boldsymbol{\sigma} = 0)$$

$$D_t \theta \triangleq d_t \theta + \boldsymbol{u}^* \cdot \nabla \theta dt + \boldsymbol{\sigma} d\boldsymbol{B}_t \cdot \nabla \theta - \frac{1}{2} \nabla \cdot (\boldsymbol{a} \nabla \theta) dt = 0$$
corrected drift
$$u - \frac{1}{2} \nabla \cdot \boldsymbol{a}$$

Barotropic Quasi-Geostrophic Model under LU (Resseguier et al. 2017; Li et al. 2019)

Evolution of the potential vorticity with source processes :

$$D_t q = S_1(\boldsymbol{\nabla} \boldsymbol{u}) dt + S_2(\boldsymbol{\nabla} \boldsymbol{u}) d\boldsymbol{B}_t$$

Evolution of the stream function :

$$q = \Delta \psi - \psi / L_R^2 + f$$

Strong incompressible constraints :

$$\boldsymbol{u} = \boldsymbol{\nabla}^{\perp} \boldsymbol{\psi}, \quad \boldsymbol{\sigma} \mathrm{d} \boldsymbol{B}_t = \boldsymbol{\nabla}^{\perp} \boldsymbol{\varphi} \mathrm{d} \boldsymbol{B}_t, \quad \boldsymbol{\nabla} \cdot \boldsymbol{u}^{\star} = 0$$

Conservation of total energy :

$$\frac{\mathrm{d}}{\mathrm{d}t} \int_D \frac{1}{2} \left[\|\boldsymbol{\nabla}\psi\|^2 + (\psi/L_R^2)^2 \right] = 0$$

$$\left[\text{Sketch} : \int_D \psi \boldsymbol{\sigma} \circ \mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{B}_t \cdot \boldsymbol{\nabla}(q-f) = \int_D \psi S_2(\boldsymbol{\nabla}\boldsymbol{u}) \circ \mathrm{d}\boldsymbol{B}_t \right]$$

Transport of a prognostic passive tracer :

$$\mathbf{D}_t q' = 0$$



Conservation of tracer energy :

$$\frac{\mathrm{d}}{\mathrm{d}t} \int_D \frac{1}{2} (q')^2 = 0$$

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Summary

A consistent stochastic model :

- Physical conservation laws satisfied
- Better ensemble spread represented
- Time-averaged profil well described on coarse mesh
