✓ **Road vehicles: underhood thermal management**

- ▷ CFD = routine tool for cruise regime (forced convection)
- ▷ Transient phases (stops): dominated by natural convection ⇒ CFD defective
- ▷ Dimensioning: costly wind-tunnel experiments using full size models
- ▷ Ambition fixed in 2015: full digital in 2025

✓ **Nuclear engineering**

- ▷ Importance of natural convection: thermal shocks, stratification, boiling, *etc.*
- ▷ Improvement of safety and extension of the lifespan of the power plants
- ▷ Design of future generations of power plants, including SMR

**Very different industrial contexts / very close scientific issues
⇒ Numerical simulation of turbulent flows in natural convection
regime**

✓ **Themes of the challenge *Clean, secure and efficient energy:***

- ▷ Design of technologies with low environmental impact
- ▷ Prevention of risks linked to energy technologies

Objectives

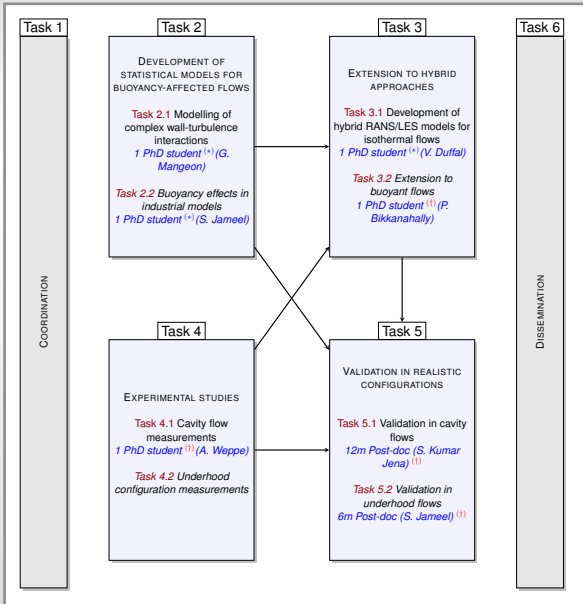
✓ Scientific objectives

- ▷ Progress in modelling of turbulence/buoyancy interactions
- ▷ Hybrid RANS/LES modelling: cost compatible with industrial needs
- ▷ Statistical approach (RANS) (low cost) where possible
- ▷ Fine-grained description of turbulence (LES) only where necessary
- ▷ New experimental database in cavity = unique database open to the community

✓ Technical objectives

- ▷ Propose a numerical methodology for dimensioning, operational reliability and safety
- ▷ Address regimes dominated by natural convection, which were not addressed numerically
- ▷ Decision-making tools in order to reach the appropriate methodology for the high-performance design of low-emission vehicle and power plants with a high level of safety

- ✓ 2 PhD theses and 18 months of post-doc supported by the ANR

Summary of the results

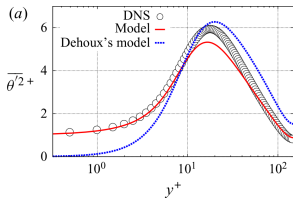


Figure: Temperature variance at the wall: conjugate heat transfer

- ✓ Dynamic second-moment closure (EB-RSM)
- ✓ Thermal second-moment closure (EB-DFM)
- ⇒ Extension to all possible boundary conditions

- ✓ Eddy-viscosity models (automotive industry)
- ✓ Issue of the sensitivity to buoyancy
- ⇒ Extension of the model (Boussinesq) to buoyancy

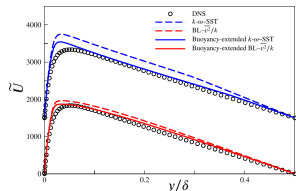


Figure: Velocity in a differentially heated infinite cavity

Summary of the results

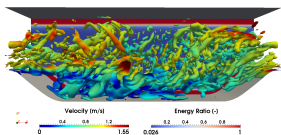


Figure: Q contours in a periodic hill flow

- ✓ Development of the HTLES hybrid RANS/LES model in Code_Saturne
- ✓ Improvement of the model (theory → practice)
- ✓ Convincing results for wall-bounded dynamics
- ✓ Encouraging for mechanical and thermal fatigue

- ✓ Extension of the HTLES approach to natural convection
- ✓ Problems at the RANS → LES transition
- ⇒ New model (elliptic shielding)

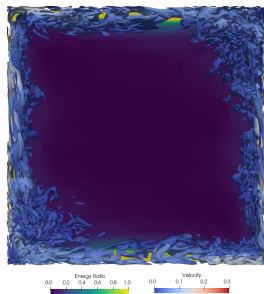


Figure: Q contours in a differentially-heated cavity

Summary of the results

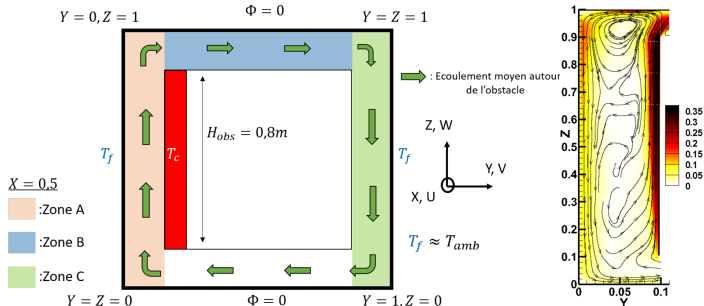


Figure: Cavity with a partially heated inner obstacle at $Ra = 1.4 \times 10^9$

- ✓ Experimental configuration representative of the underhood of a vehicle
- ✓ PIV (mean and rms velocities) and thermocouples (temperature)
- ✓ Stationary and transient cases
- ✓ Identification of a complex physics (laminar/turbulent transition, high and low frequencies, complex recirculation patterns, flapping of the jet)
- ✓ Ongoing validation of models from RANS to LES
