The increasing complexity of software and hardware systems and their ever more central role in society poses many challenges concerning their reliability, safety, correctness, and robustness. Based on a variety of fundamental concepts from theoretical computer science, formal methods techniques aim at making a significant contribution to better quality systems. The development and use of formal methods aspire to mathematically sound methods and tools for system analysis and verification.

This volume contains the selected and revised papers of the 9th IPM International Conference on Fundamentals of Software Engineering (FSEN 2021). Due to the continuing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, this event was held as a virtual event and run from Tehran, Iran, during May 19–21, 2021. This biennial event is organized by the School of Computer Science at the Institute for Research in Fundamental Sciences (IPM) in Iran in cooperation with ACM SIGSOFT and IFIP Working Group 2.2. The topics of interest in FSEN span over all aspects of formal methods, especially those related to advancing the application of formal methods in the software industry and promoting their integration with practical engineering techniques.
