- Requirements: Stable, Generic, Precise

• $e^{-d_a/\lambda}$ and $e^{-d_b/\lambda}$ chosen as the most informative elements of the family.

Algorithm in practice



Convergence of methods

$$f(x) = ((x-1)(x-.2)(x-.5)(x-.7)(x)100+1)e^{-.1/x}$$



The projection method converges faster than Newtons or Gauss numerical methods.

Numerical complexity

Double Netwon integration: $O(N_{space} \cdot (M_{wavelength} + N_{space}))$

Naive analytical spectral integration: $O(N_{space} \cdot (Deg(P) + N_{space}))$

Run-time integration: $\mathcal{O}(N_{space} \cdot Card_{basis} + Deg(P) \cdot Card_{basis})$

⁵N=100,M=30,C_b=3,Deg(P)=5, GPU= Nvidia GTX 1080 Ti, scene A

Numerical complexity

Double Netwon integration: $O(N_{space} \cdot (M_{wavelength} + N_{space}))$

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Run-time integration: $\mathcal{O}(N_{space} \cdot Card_{basis} + Deg(P) \cdot Card_{basis})$

Method	Avg Time per frame ⁵
Newton	260ms
Naive analytical computation	160ms
Projection	30ms

All spectra are free variables, as well as the camera position and angle.
