Introduction

International public policy on inclusive education

- Salamanca Framework for Action on Special Needs Education in 1994
 - > UK : good practice in 2001, USA : IDEA in 2004, France : governmental reforms in 2005 & 2013
- Most common form: Inclusive Education (Nilholm & Göransson, 2017)
 - > Inclusion in mainstream classroom
- Individualized Educationnal Plan

First key: collaborative team approach

> multidisciplinary team composed of teachers, administrators, parents and service providers (Lyons et al., 2016)

Second key: assistive technologies

- > Educational technologies (McNicholl et al., 2021; Pontikas et al., 2022)
- > digital education system (Cinquin et al., 2019)



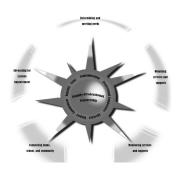

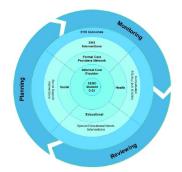
Parents-teachers collaboration

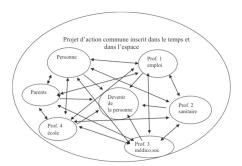
- > Well-being of children (Martinez et al., 2012)
- > Better academic performance and social adjustment (Jolilowski & Morris, 2019)
- ❖ Several barriers: lack of continuities, ≠ in the use of strategies and expectations, ≠ in perception (Roberts & Simpson, 2016)

Whole collaboration: family-school-community collaboration











Problematic

Our aim is to provide an overview of technologies that focus on collaborative process into the child's educational community including family, school, and care parties

RQ1. Domain characterization: Is there existing literature that deals with digital technologies for supporting stakeholders' collaboration to foster the school inclusion of children with special education need and disabilities? Who are the targeted children? Which journals and conferences have published them? How has the field evolved? What are the studies purposes?

RQ2. Design of technologies: How are these technologies designed? What are the technologies purposes? What functionalities do they offer to support collaboration? What are the obstacles to their development?

RQ3. Main outcomes: What research methods were used? What are the findings in terms of evaluation?



Method

Search strategy

- Databases: Scopus, Web of Sciences, EBSCOhost, Pubmed and IEEE Xplore
- Research question: Collaboration AND Stakeholder AND Inclusion AND (Autism OR special need) AND Pupil AND Technology NOT College
 - > & associated terms
- Inclusion criteria:
 - > Uses of a technology for collaboration
 - > Goal = inclusion
 - > Student with SEN & in K12
 - > Collaboration between at least two stakeholders

Study selection

- Records indentified: 1673
 - > Duplicate = 313
- Records screening: 1360
 - > Selection on title abstract
- Reports assessed for eligibility: 129
- Studies included : 10

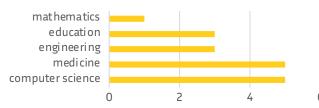

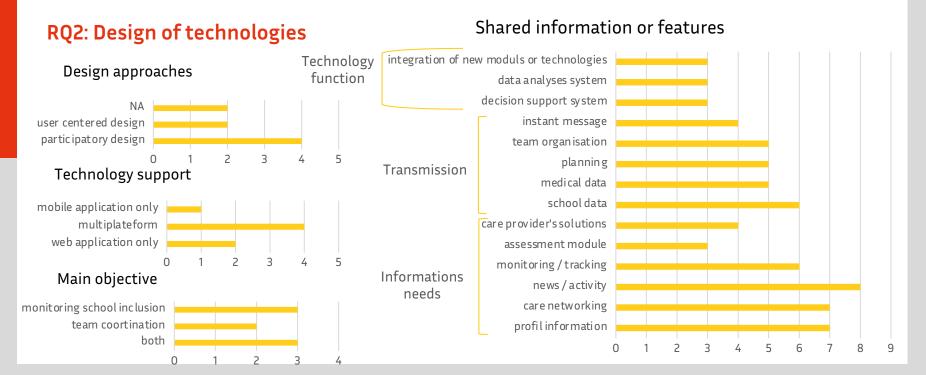

method for empirical study

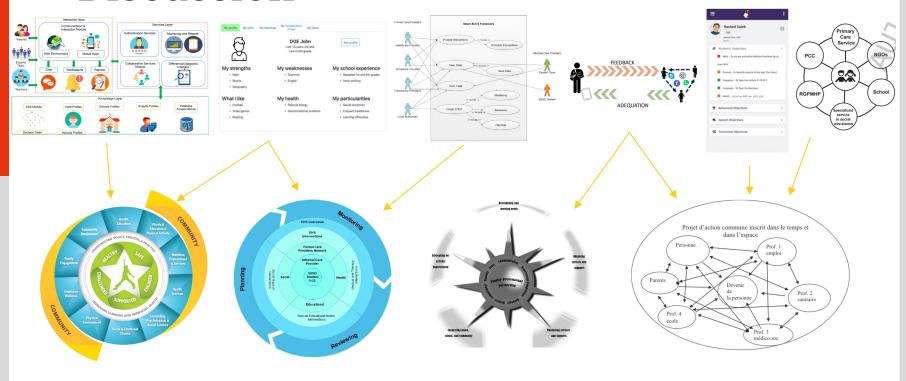




- good usability,
