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Results

Background and Aims

Meta-analysis combines study results to statistical through boost power appropriate data pooling. Ensuring accurate conclusions includes examining biases and heterogeneity. potential Random effects meta-regression is typically used to explore heterogeneity and understand sources of variability.

Bioinformatics and NGS advances have improved our understanding of the microbiota's role in health. However. considerable variability exists due to differences in study methodologies, such as pipelines, sequencing techniques, and sample collection.

In human microbiota studies beyond the gut, a limited number of studies n addressing the same research question and numerous differing characteristics d create a high-dimensional problem, necessitating adapted statistical analysis.

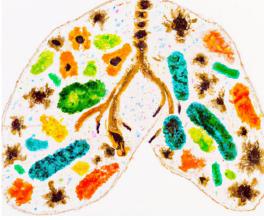
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Methods

Data from Ake et al. WoM 23:

- Mean-SD differences in the Shannon index between cases and controls

- Technics: sampling, sequencing, rarefaction, taxonomy, ASV

- Population: age, continent, disease, group status

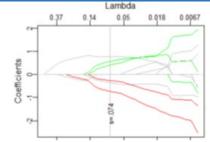
Exploring sources of variability :

- Weighted Lasso regression with stability selection (glmnet, stabs)

- Separate random effects metaregressions (R package metaphor)

Conclusion

significantly Method choice impacts source variability identification. Lasso study heterogeneity lacks control, separate models lacks adjustment. Futur: Lasso random effects meta-regression (dependencies: glmnet and metaphor).
