Mission statement

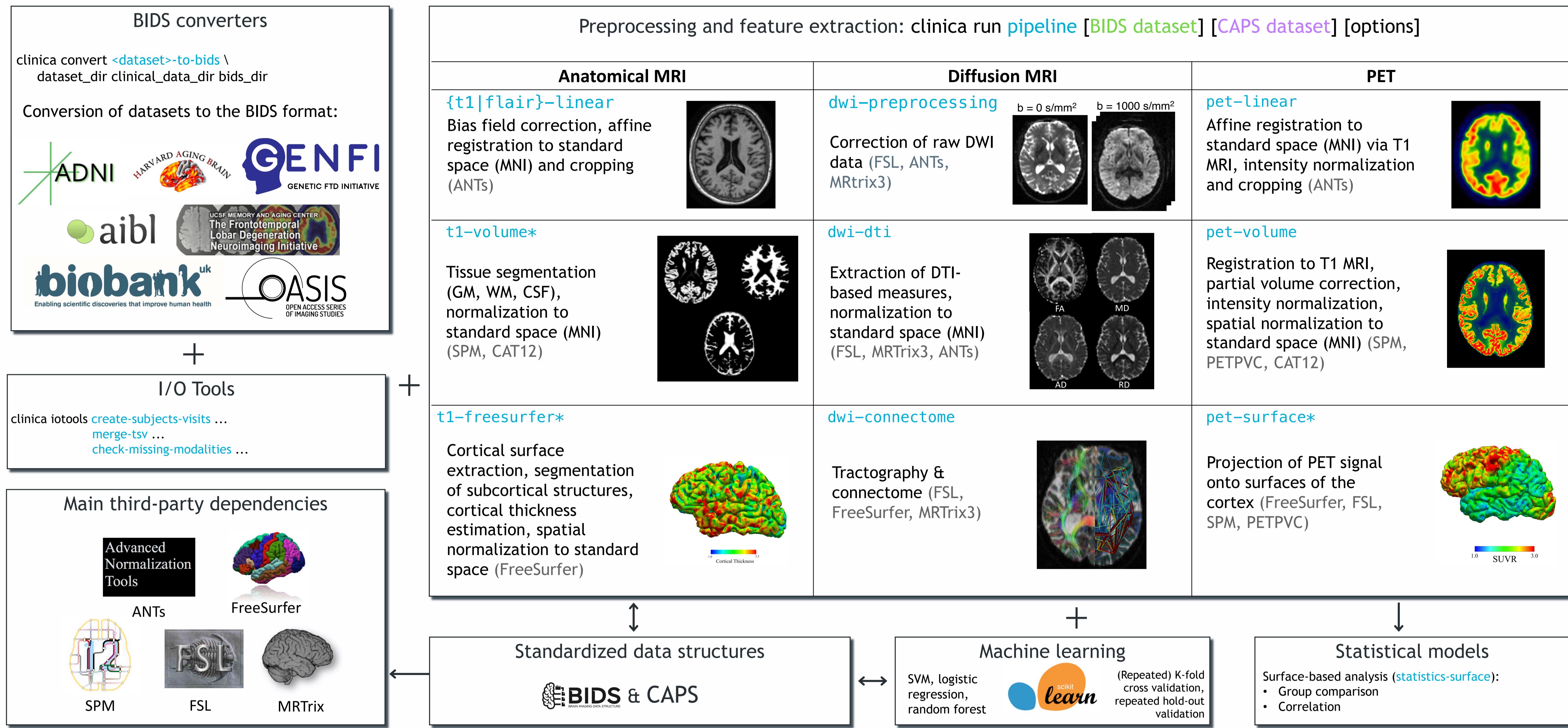

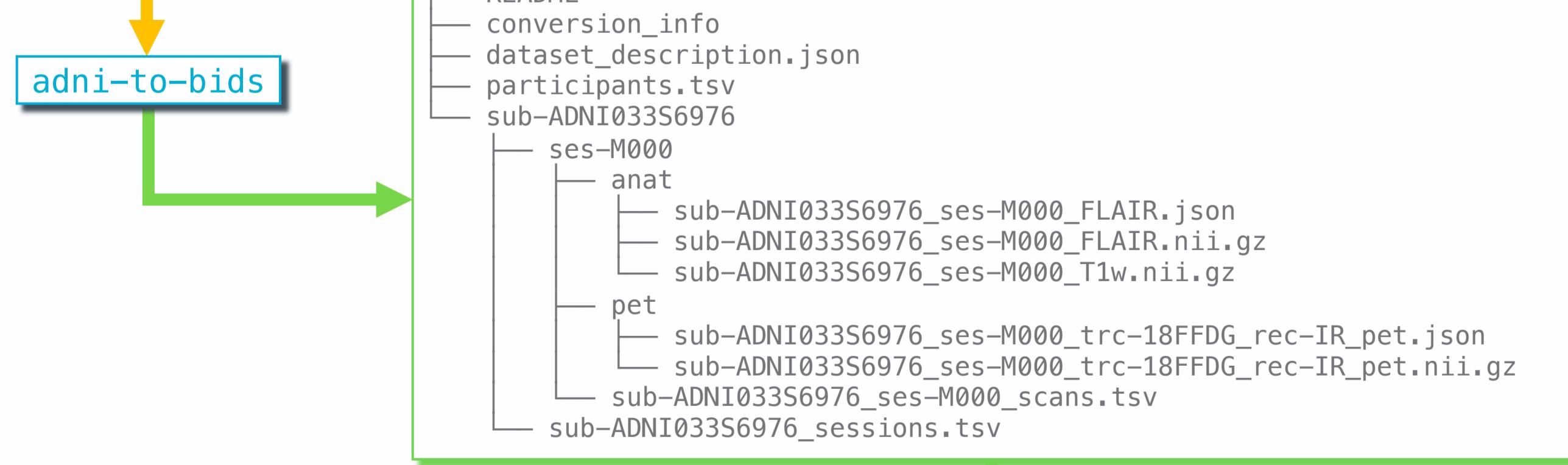
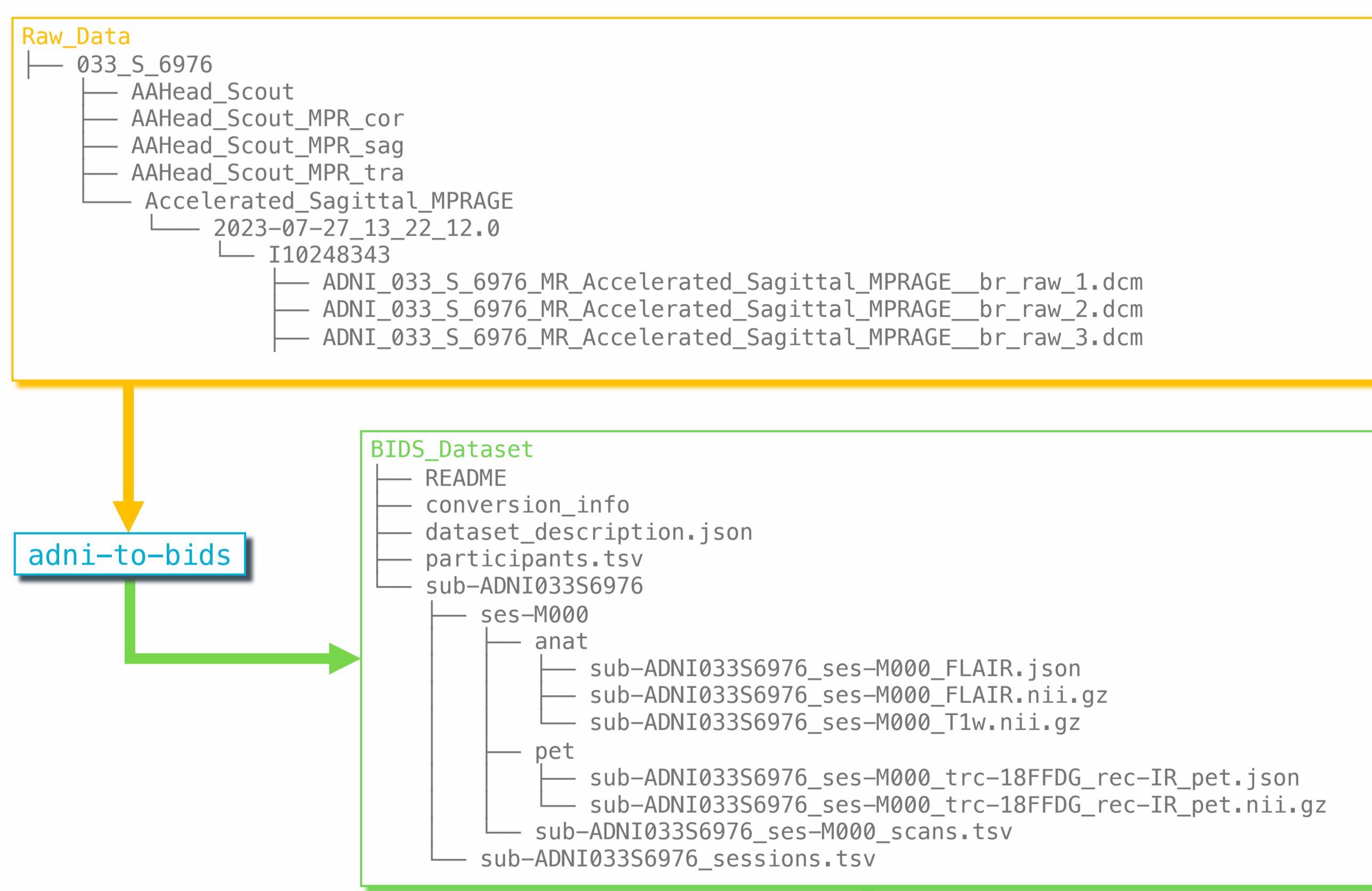
Example: processing from unorganized neuroimaging data to Pytorch tensors using Clinica and ClinicaDL

```
# Step 1 - Convert the data downloaded from ADNI to the BIDS format:
clinica convert adni-to-bids Raw_Data Clinical_Data BIDS_Dataset

# Step 2 - Run t1-linear to align the T1 images with the MNI template:
clinica run t1-linear BIDS_Dataset CAPS_Dataset

# Step 3 - Run pet-linear to align the PET images with the MNI template:
clinica run pet-linear BIDS_Dataset CAPS_Dataset Acq_Label
{pons|cerebellumPons|pons2|cerebellumPons2}

# Step 4 - Extract the tensors using ClinicaDL:
clinicadl prepare-data {image|slice|patch|roi} CAPS_Dataset {t1-linear|t2-linear|t1-extensive|dwi-dti|pet-linear|flair-linear|custom}

Work in progress and future works

Quality control: Explore methods and processes to provide quality control feedback

Pipelines: Development of new longitudinal pipelines

Clinica: Development of a web-based dashboard for pipeline monitoring and quality control

Provenance: Adherence to the BIDS provenance standard to improve traceability and reproducibility
