This Special Section of Computers & Graphics (C&G), features the full papers presented at the Shape Modeling International 2024 conference — SMI 2024 (https://smiconf.github.io/2024/). The conference was organised by the *Computer Graphics and Imaging Lab* and hosted at *Wayne State University*, July 11 to 13, 2024.

Shape Modeling International provides yearly an international forum for the dissemination of new mathematical theories and computational techniques for modeling, simulating, and processing digital representations of shapes and their properties to a community of researchers, developers, students, and practitioners across a wide range of fields. The invited speakers, Professor Wenping Wang from Texas A&M University, USA, and Professor Hao (Richard) Zhang from Simon Fraser University, Canada, provided interesting insights on Neural reconstruction and generation of 3D shapes and on Learning differentiable primitive representations for CAD shape modeling, respectively.

SMI2024 has assigned four prestigious prizes, namely, two Tosiyasu L. Kunii distinguished researcher awards, presented to **Prof. Stefanie Hahmann** from *Grenoble INP and INRIA*, France and to **Prof. Gershon Elber** from *Technion*, Israel, and two SMI young investigator awards, presented to **Dr. Amal Dev Parakkat** from *Telecom Paris Tech* in France and to **Dr. Gianmarco Cherchi** from *University of Cagliary*, Italy. Furthermore, this year the Alexander Pasko service award, recognizing people who made significant contributions to the organization of SMI conferences, has been presented to **Prof. Ergun Akleman** from

Texas A&M University, USA, for his long-standing support to Shape Modeling International, besides his scientific contributions to the field. Interviews of all awardees featuring pictures have been collected and published in Computer & Graphics [1].

The full paper submission track followed a 2-stage doubleblind review process. Each paper was assessed by 4 reviewers on average. Of the 31 papers submitted to the full paper track 11 were accepted and are published in this Special Section of Computers & Graphics. Besides the 11 reviewed papers, SMI2024 invited papers from Computer & Graphics; 4 accepted the invitation and have been presented at the conference: Interactive pose and shape editing with simple sketches from different viewing angles [2], by Caro Schmitz, Constantin Rösch, Domenic Zingsheim and Reinhard Klein, Neural inverse procedural modeling of knitting yarns from images [3] by Elena Trunz, Jonathan Klein, Jan Müller, Lukas Bode, Ralf Sarlette, Michael Weinmann and Reinhard Klein, TAssembly: Data-driven fractured object assembly using a linear template model [4] by Ziyue Deng, Junfeng Jiang, Zhengming Chen, Wenxi Zhang, Qingqiang Yao, Chen Song, Yifan Sun, Zhenpei Yang, Siming Yan, Qixing Huang and Chandrajit Bajaj, and TARig: Adaptive template-aware neural rigging for humanoid characters [5], by Jing Ma and Dongliang Zhang.

SMI2024 received financial sponsorship from Elsevier for the *Best Paper Award* and one *Honourable Mention*. After all the presentations, the SMI award committee selected the best paper among those who have obtained the replicability stamp, to encourage researchers to publish their code and make it available to the community. The SMI2024 best paper award has been presented to Yukun Lu, Yuhang Wang, Peng Song, Hang Siang Wong, Yingjuan Mok and Ligang Liu for the paper *Computa*-

tional design of custom-fit PAP masks [6], and the honourable mention went to Guillaume Gisbert, Raphaëlle Chaine and David Coeurjolly for the paper Neural inpainting of folded fabrics with interactive editing [7].

versity of Kaiserslautern, Germany, in 1993. His research centres on Computer Aided Geometric Design, Computational Fabrication, Data Visualization and Visual perception for Computer graphics. He was co-organizer of two Dagstuhl seminars on Scientific Visualization. He is a past member of the Editorial Board Committee of IEEE Transactions on Visualization and Computer Graphics and a current member of the Editorial Board Committee of Computer Aided Design, Elsevier.



Tao Ju is a Professor in the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at Washington University in St. Louis. He obtained his B.S. and B.A. degrees from Tsinghua University in 2000, and his M.S. and PhD degrees in Computer Science from

Rice University in 2005. He conducts research in computer graphics and bio-medical applications, and is particularly interested in geometric modeling and shape analysis. He has served



Zichun Zhong is Associate Professor of Computer Science at Wayne State University, USA. He received his Ph.D. from The University of Texas at Dallas in 2014 and was a postdoctoral fellow at UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas from 2014 to 2015. His research interests focus on geometric modeling and computing for computer graphics, 3D computer vision, visualization, and medical image processing. He serves as the asso-

ciate editor of GMOD, guest editors of CAGD and C&G. He is a Technical Paper Chair of SMI 2024 and a Program Co-Chair of GMP 2024. He serves as a program committee member, area chair, and reviewer for many international conferences and journals in his research field.
