A web-platform for medical imaging data

With the impetus towards open science, researchers are increasingly asked to share more data in support of their findings. In the field of brain imaging, European researchers must comply with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) when sharing human neuroimaging data.

We present **Shanoir**, a long-standing open source web-platform for medical imaging data that can be used to share neuroimaging data in compliance with GDPR.

Data sharing with Shanoir

Non anonymous (Individualisation)
Data sharing must comply with GDPR
(Open Brain Consent, HBM 2021)

3 steps

- 1- List shared datasets
<https://shanoir.singulair.net/>
- 2- Sign the Data User Agreement
- 3- Access the data
