#### Skin effect in a half-space

Skin Effect: in 
$$\{z > 0\}$$
,

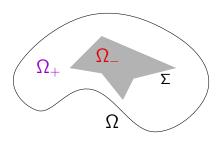
$$\|\mathbf{E}_{\sigma}(z)\| = E_0 e^{-z/\ell(\sigma)}$$

Skin Depth:

$$\ell(\sigma) = \sqrt{2/\omega\mu_0\sigma}$$

## The Model Problem



- $\Omega_{-}$  Highly Conducting body  $\subset\subset\Omega$ : Conductivity  $\sigma_{-}\equiv\sigma\gg1$
- $\Sigma = \partial \Omega_-$ : Interface
- ullet  $\Omega_+$  Insulating or Dielectric body: Conductivity  $\sigma_+=0$

### **Maxwell Problem**

Issue and Framework

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{\sigma}}) \qquad \mathrm{curl}\, \mathbf{E} - i\omega \mu_0 \mathbf{H} = \mathbf{0} \quad \mathrm{and} \quad \mathrm{curl}\, \mathbf{H} + (i\omega \varepsilon_0 - \underline{\sigma}) \mathbf{E} = \mathbf{j} \quad \underline{\sigma} = (\mathbf{0}, \sigma)$$

Issue: *Uniform*  $L^2$  *estimates* for solutions (E, H) of  $(P_{\sigma})$  as  $\sigma \to \infty$ ?

Issue and Framework

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\sigma})$$
 curl  $\mathbf{E} - i\omega \mu_0 \mathbf{H} = 0$  and curl  $\mathbf{H} + (i\omega \varepsilon_0 - \underline{\sigma}) \mathbf{E} = \mathbf{j}$   $\underline{\sigma} = (0, \sigma)$ 

Issue: *Uniform*  $L^2$  *estimates* for solutions  $({\sf E},{\sf H})$  of  $({\sf P}_\sigma)$  as  $\sigma\to\infty$  ?

#### **Hypothesis**

 $\Sigma$  is a bounded Lipschitz surface in  $\mathbb{R}^3$ 

#### Hypothesis (SH)

The angular frequency  $\omega$  is not an eigenfrequency of the problem

$$\begin{cases} & \operatorname{curl} \mathbf{E} - i\omega \mu_0 \mathbf{H} = 0 \quad \text{and} \quad \operatorname{curl} \mathbf{H} + i\omega \varepsilon_0 \mathbf{E} = 0 \quad \text{in} \quad \Omega_+ \\ & \mathbf{E} \times \mathbf{n} = 0 & \text{on} \quad \Sigma \\ & \mathbf{B}.\mathbf{C}. & \text{on} \quad \partial \Omega \end{cases}$$

#### **Maxwell Problem**

Uniform  $L^2(\Omega)$  Estimates

Boundary Conditions :  $\mathbf{E} \times \mathbf{n} = 0$  on  $\partial \Omega$   $\mathbf{j} \in H(div, \Omega) = \{\mathbf{u} \in L^2(\Omega) \mid div \, \mathbf{u} \in L^2(\Omega)\}$ 

#### Theorem (CALOZ, DAUGE, P., 09)

Proof by contradiction: keys

$$\operatorname{curl} \mathbf{H} + \underbrace{\left(i\omega\varepsilon_0 - \underline{\sigma}\right)}_{=:\underline{a}} (\mathbf{w} + \nabla\varphi) = \mathbf{j} \longrightarrow \operatorname{div} \underline{\mathbf{a}} \nabla\varphi = \operatorname{div} \mathbf{j} - \underbrace{\operatorname{div} \underline{\mathbf{a}} \mathbf{w}}_{=[\underline{a}]_{\Sigma} \mathbf{w} \cdot \mathbf{n}}_{=[\underline{a}]_{\Sigma} \mathbf{w} \cdot \mathbf{n}}$$

Issue: Uniform piecewise regularity for div a grad  $\varphi = f + [a]_{\Sigma} g$  as  $|a_{-}/a_{+}| \to \infty$ ?

#### Scalar Problem

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{a}})$$
:  $\operatorname{div} \underline{a} \operatorname{grad} \varphi = f + [\underline{a}]_{\Sigma} g$  as  $|\rho| := |a_{-}/a_{+}| \to \infty$ 

#### Theorem (CALOZ, DAUGE, P., 09)

There exists  $\rho_0>0$  independent of  $a_+\neq 0$  s. t. for all  $a_-\in \{z\in \mathbb{C}\,|\,|z|\geqslant \rho_0|a_+|\}$ , and for all  $(f,g)\in L^2(\Omega)\times L^2(\Sigma)$  s.t.  $\int_\Sigma g\,\mathrm{d} s=0$ ,  $(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{a}})$  has a unique solution  $\varphi\in H^1_0(\Omega)$ , piecewise  $H^{3/2}$  and

$$\|\varphi^{+}\|_{\frac{3}{2},\Omega_{+}} + \|\varphi^{-}\|_{\frac{3}{2},\Omega_{-}} \leqslant C_{\rho_{0}}(|a_{+}|^{-1}\|f\|_{0,\Omega} + \|g\|_{0,\Sigma})$$

with  $C_{\rho_0} > 0$ , independent of  $a_+$ ,  $a_-$ , f, and g.

#### Scalar Problem

$$(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{a}})$$
:  $\operatorname{div} \underline{\mathbf{a}} \operatorname{grad} \varphi = \mathbf{f} + [\underline{\mathbf{a}}]_{\Sigma} g$  as  $|\rho| := |\mathbf{a}_{-}/\mathbf{a}_{+}| \to \infty$ 

#### Theorem (CALOZ, DAUGE, P., 09)

There exists  $ho_0>0$  independent of  $a_+\neq 0$  s. t. for all  $a_-\in \{z\in \mathbb{C}\ |\ |z|\geqslant 
ho_0|a_+|\}$ , and for all  $(f,g)\in L^2(\Omega)\times L^2(\Sigma)$  s.t.  $\int_\Sigma g\,\mathrm{d} s=0$ ,  $(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{a}})$  has a unique solution  $\varphi\in H^1_0(\Omega)$ , piecewise  $H^{3/2}$  and

$$\|\varphi^{+}\|_{\frac{3}{2},\Omega_{+}} + \|\varphi^{-}\|_{\frac{3}{2},\Omega_{-}} \leqslant C_{\rho_{0}}(|a_{+}|^{-1}\|f\|_{0,\Omega} + \|g\|_{0,\Sigma})$$

with  $C_{
ho_0}>0$ , independent of  $a_+$ ,  $a_-$ , f, and g.

#### Key of the Proof:

$$\varphi^+ = \sum_{n=0}^\infty \, \varphi_n^+ \, \rho^{-n} \quad \Omega_+ \qquad \text{and} \qquad \varphi^- = \sum_{n=0}^\infty \, \varphi_n^- \, \rho^{-n} \quad \Omega_-$$

#### Remarks

- Similar estimate hold when a<sub>+</sub> and a<sub>-</sub> are switched.
   More precise estimate when a<sub>+</sub> and a<sub>-</sub> play symmetric roles
- The assumption that Σ is Lipschitz is necessary
- ullet For polyhedral Lipschitz interface  $\Sigma$

$$\|\varphi^{+}\|_{s,\Omega_{+}} + \|\varphi^{-}\|_{s,\Omega_{-}} \leqslant C_{\rho_{0}}(|a_{+}|^{-1}\|f\|_{s-2,\Omega} + \|g\|_{s-\frac{3}{2},\Sigma})$$

for  $s \leqslant \mathit{s}_{\Sigma}$  with some  $\frac{3}{2} < \mathit{s}_{\Sigma} \leqslant 2$ 

 For smooth interface  $\Sigma,$  uniform piecewise  $H^s$  estimates for any  $s\geqslant 2$

#### **Hypothesis**

- Σ is a Smooth Surface
- $oldsymbol{\omega}$  satisfies the Spectral Hypothesis (SH)
- $oldsymbol{\circ}$   $\mathbf{j}\in \mathrm{H}(\mathrm{div},\Omega)$  and  $\mathbf{j}=0$  in  $\Omega_-$
- Perfectly Conducting Electric B.C.

By Theorem there exists  $\delta_0$  s.t. for all  $\delta \leqslant \delta_0$ , there exists a unique solution  $(\mathbf{E}_{(\delta)},\mathbf{H}_{(\delta)})$  to  $(\mathbf{P}_{\underline{\sigma}})$

Under Hypothesis in the framework above, for all  $m \in \mathbb{N}$  and  $\delta \in (0, \delta_0]$ , the remainders  $\mathbf{R}_{m; \delta}$  satisfy the optimal estimates

$$\begin{split} \|\mathbf{R}_{m;\,\delta}^{+}\|_{0,\Omega_{+}} + \|\operatorname{curl} \mathbf{R}_{m;\,\delta}^{+}\|_{0,\Omega_{+}} \\ + \delta^{-\frac{1}{2}} \|\mathbf{R}_{m;\,\delta}^{-}\|_{0,\Omega_{-}} + \delta^{\frac{1}{2}} \|\operatorname{curl} \mathbf{R}_{m;\,\delta}^{-}\|_{0,\Omega_{-}} \leqslant C_{m}' \, \delta^{m+1} \end{split}$$

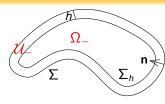

$$D_{\alpha}^{h}E_{\beta}=\partial_{\alpha}E_{\beta}-\Gamma_{\alpha\beta}^{\gamma}(h)E_{\gamma}$$

#### A New Definition of the Skin Depth

3D model :  $\mathbf{V}_{(\delta)}(y_{\alpha}, y_3) := \mathbf{H}_{(\delta)}^{-}(\mathbf{x}), \quad y_{\alpha} \in \Sigma, \quad 0 \leq y_3 < h_0$ 

#### Definition

Let  $\Sigma$  be a smooth surface, and  $\mathbf{j}$  s.t.  $\mathbf{V}_{(\delta)}(y_{\alpha},0) \neq 0$ . The skin depth is the smallest length  $\mathcal{L}(\sigma,y_{\alpha})$  defined on  $\Sigma$  s.t.

$$\|\mathbf{V}_{(\delta)}(y_{\alpha},\mathcal{L}(\sigma,y_{\alpha}))\| = \|\mathbf{V}_{(\delta)}(y_{\alpha},0)\| e^{-1}$$

#### Theorem (DAUGE, FAOU, P., 10)

Let  $\Sigma$  be a regular surface with mean curvature  $\mathcal{H}$ , and assume  $\mathbf{h}_0(\mathbf{y}_{\alpha}) \neq 0$ .

$$\mathcal{L}(\sigma, y_{\alpha}) = \ell(\sigma) \Big( 1 + \mathcal{H}(y_{\alpha}) \, \ell(\sigma) + \mathcal{O}(\sigma^{-1}) \Big), \quad \sigma \to \infty$$

$$\|\boldsymbol{V}_{(\delta)}\|^2 = \left[\|\boldsymbol{h}_0\|^2 + 2\delta\operatorname{Re}\langle\boldsymbol{h}_0,\boldsymbol{h}_1\rangle + 2y_3 \frac{\mathcal{H}}{\mathcal{H}}\|\boldsymbol{h}_0\|^2 + \mathcal{O}((\delta + y_3)^2)\right]e^{-2y_3/\ell(\sigma)}$$

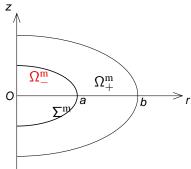


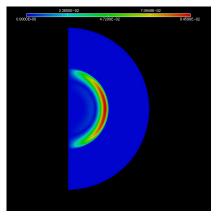
Figure: The meridian domain. Configuration A

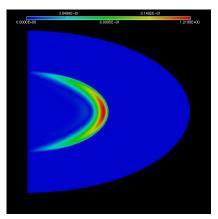

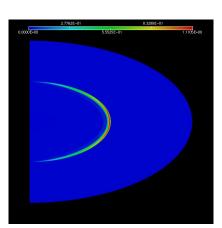

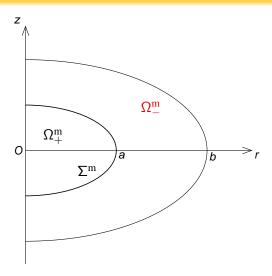

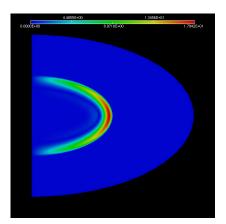

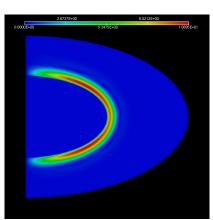
**Figure:** Configuration B.  $\mathcal{H} < 0$

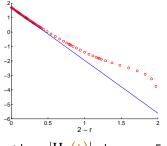

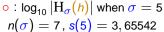

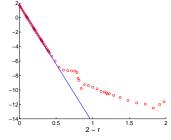

$$error(\sigma) := \left| \frac{\mathtt{S}(\sigma) - \mathtt{s}(\sigma)}{\mathtt{S}(\sigma)} \right|$$

## Convergence w.r.t. Interpolation degree p

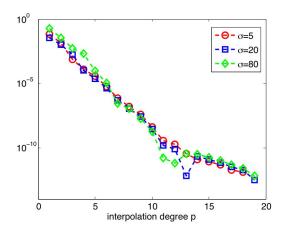
 $H^p_\sigma$ : the computed solution of the discretize problem with an interpolation degree  $p=1,\cdots,20$  and a fixed mesh

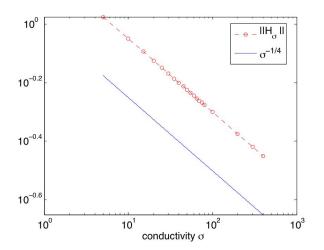
