### NONSMOOTH PROBLEMS

- 1. Nondegenerated Necessary Conditions for State Constrained Problems
- 2. Refining Necessary Conditions
  - weak assumptions and/or stronger conclusions
  - easily translated in computational schemes
  - special interest on state constrained problems
- 3. Necessary Conditions for various non standard problems
  - Hybrid optimal control, Free time problems,
  - infinite horizon problems, nonregular mixed constrained problems
- 5. Relations between sets of Necessary Conditions
- 6. Applications vs Theory



Necessary conditions under "minimal assumptions"

Based on Clarke's monograpgh 2005.

 $\begin{array}{ll} \text{Multifunction} & \Gamma: \mathbb{R}^n \to \mathbb{R}^m \text{ multifunction}.\\\\ \text{Graph of } \Gamma: & G \subset \mathbb{R}^n \times \mathbb{R}^m. \end{array}$ 

**Definition:**  $\Gamma$  satisfies the **bounded slope condition** near  $(\bar{x}, \bar{v})$  (with parameters  $\varepsilon$ , R, K), if  $x \in B(\bar{x}, \epsilon), v \in B(\bar{v}, R), (\alpha, \beta) \in N_G^P(x, v) \Longrightarrow |\alpha| \le K|\beta|.$ 

If  $\Gamma$  is **pseudo Lipchitz**, then it satisfies the **bounded slope condition**.

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### **NEW DEVELOPMENTS**

$$\operatorname{Min}\, l(x(a), x(b))$$

s.t.

$$\dot{x}(t) \in F(t, x(t))$$
 a.e.  
 $(x(a), x(b)) \in E$ 

•  $R: [a, b] \rightarrow ]0, +\infty]$  a measurable function  $\bar{x}$  local minimum of radius R if  $\exists \epsilon > 0: |\dot{x}(t) - \dot{\bar{x}}(t)| \le R(t)$  a.e,  $\int_{a}^{b} |\dot{x}(t) - \dot{\bar{x}}(t)| dt \le \epsilon, \quad ||x - \bar{x}||_{\infty} \le \epsilon$ we have  $l(x(a), x(b)) \ge l(\bar{x}(a), \bar{x}(b))$ 

#### **Necessary Conditions**

$$\begin{aligned} &(\lambda, p(t)) \neq 0\\ &\dot{p}(t) \in \operatorname{co} \left\{ w: \ (w, p(t)) \in N_{G(t)}^{L}(\bar{x}(t), \dot{\bar{x}}(t)) \right\} \text{ a.e.}\\ &\langle p(t), v) \rangle \leq \langle p(t), \dot{\bar{x}}(t) \rangle \ \forall v \in F(t, \bar{x}(t)) \cap \bar{B}(\dot{\bar{x}}(t), R(t)) \text{ a.e.}\\ &(p(a), -p(b)) \in \partial^{L} \lambda l(\bar{x}(a), \bar{x}(b)) + N_{E}^{L}(\bar{x}(a), \bar{x}(b)) \end{aligned}$$



This result is a main tool in the derivation of refinements of necessary conditions for various problems. For example:

(New)Nonsmooth Maximum Principle

 $\checkmark$  For standard optimal control problems—for convex-linear case it is a

sufficient and necessary condition

 $\checkmark$  For general mixed constrained problems including problems with DAE

□ For problems with state constraints ?



Necessary conditions for general free time problems

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## **MIXED CONTRAINED O.C. P.**

 $\operatorname{Min} l(x(a), x(b))$ s.t.  $\dot{x}(t) \in F(t, x(t))$ a.e.  $(x(a), x(b)) \in E$ 

$$F(t,x) = \{v: v = f(t,x,u), (x,u) \in S(t)\}$$

Necessary conditions for such problems called for some regularity assumptions on the mixed constraints

called full rank conditions

For Example: If  $S(t) = \{(x, u) : b(t, x, u) = 0\},\$ then assume that  $\det B(t)B^T(t) > K$ , where  $B(t) = \nabla_u b(t, x(t), u(t))$ 



## MIXED CONTRAINED O.C. P.





$$\begin{aligned} & \operatorname{Min} \, l(x(a), x(b)) \\ & \text{s.t.} \\ & \dot{x}(t) \in F(t, x(t)) \quad \text{a.e.} \\ & (x(a), x(b)) \in E \end{aligned}$$

$$F(t,x) = \{v: v = f(t,x,u), (x,u) \in S(t)\}$$

### **NEW NECESSARY CONDITIONS**

$$\exists p, \lambda_0 : (i) (\lambda_0, p(t)) \neq 0, (ii) (-\dot{p}(t), 0) \in \partial_{x,u}^C \langle p(t), f(t, \bar{x}(t), \bar{u}(t)) \rangle + N_{S(t)}^C (\bar{x}(t), \bar{u}(t)), (iii) \forall (\bar{x}(t), u) \in S(t), |u - \bar{u}(t)| \leq R(t) \langle p(t), f(t, \bar{x}(t), u) \rangle \leq \langle p(t), f(t, \bar{x}(t), \bar{u}(t)) \rangle, (iv) (p(a), -p(b)) \in \lambda_0 \partial_L l(\bar{x}(a), \bar{x}(b)) + N_E^L(\bar{x}(a), \bar{x}(b)).$$



IMPORTANCE OF SUCH RESULT: Necessary conditions in the form of a maximum principle under somewhat minimal assumptions

#### **SPECIAL CASEs**

In many problems we have state-control constraints with ''two'' controls:

 $u(t)=(v(t),w(t)),\quad (x(t),v(t))\in S(t),\ w(t) \text{ unconstrained}.$ 

Then the **bounded slope condition** is imposed only on S(t).

**PROBLEMS WITH DIFFERENTIAL AND ALGEBRAIC EQUATIONS** 

The Problem Min l(x(a), x(b))s.t.  $h(t, x(t), u(t), \dot{x}(t)) = 0$  a.e.  $u(t) \in U(t)$  a.e.  $(x(a), x(b)) \in E$ 

"Bounded Slope" condition  $(x, u, v) \in S_*^{\varepsilon}(t), \ \lambda \in \mathbb{R}^N, \ \mu \in N_{U(t)}L(\bar{u}(t), (\alpha, \beta - \mu, \gamma) \in \partial^L \langle h(t, x, u, v), \lambda \rangle$   $\Rightarrow |\alpha| \leq M(t) |(\beta, \gamma)|.$ 



**NEW DEVELOPMENTS** 

### **Euler Inclusion:**

$$(-\dot{p}(t),0) \in \partial_{x,u}^C \langle p(t), \bar{f}(t,\bar{x}(t),\bar{u}(t)) \rangle + N_{S(t)}^C(\bar{x}(t),\bar{u}(t))$$

With

$$S(t) = \{(x, u) : u \in U, g(t, x, u) \le 0, b(t, x, u) = 0\}$$

one would hope to have some **MULTIPLIERS** in the Euler inclusion instead of the Normal cone.

This is possible if one assumes g and b to be continuously. differentiable, for example.

# Assuming some smoothness...





## Euler Inclusion: Nonsmooth to Smooth

$$S(t) = \{(x, u) : u \in U(t), g(t, x, u) \leq 0, b(t, x, u) = 0\}$$

$$(-\dot{p}(t), 0) \in \partial_{x, u}^{C} \langle p(t), \bar{f}(t) \rangle + N_{S(t)}^{C}(\bar{x}(t)(t), \bar{u}(t))$$

$$(-\dot{p}(t), 0) \in D_{x, u} \langle (p, \lambda, \gamma), (\bar{f}, -\bar{b}, -\bar{g}) \rangle + \{0\} \times N_{U(t)}^{C}(\bar{u}(t))$$
Smooth b and g:



Drawback: 
$$|f(t, x_1, u_1) - f(t, x_2, u_2)| \le k_x^f(t)|x_1 - x_2| + k_u^f(t)|u_1 - u_2|$$

**Question:** Any alternative regularity assumption for the bounded slope condition and w/o Lipschitz continuity wrt u?

Answer: in some cases, YES. Roughly speaking we get NC assuming, for

$$S(t) = \left\{ (x, u): \ \varphi(t, x, u) \in \Phi(t) \right\}, \quad u(t) \in U(t)$$

that the following holds

$$B(\varphi(t,\bar{x}(t),\bar{u}(t)),\delta) \subset \varphi(t,\bar{x}(t),U(t))$$

COVERING CONDITION

but we also need to assume that

 $\{(f(x,u),\varphi(t,x,u)): u \in U(t)\}$  is convex.



## **Open Problems**

- For mixed (state-control) constraints
   Identify other situations where multipliers can stated in terms of multipliers and not the normal cone to the constrained set.
- Extensions to state constrained problems and problems with both state and mixed constraints.
- Determination of NC for general Free Time problems
